NAC gives BEH FBO with no conditions

The Norwood Airport Commission (NAC) voted unanimously on Monday, Aug. 27, to grant Boston Executive Helicopters (BEH) Fixed Base Operator (FBO) status with no conditional requirements.

According to NAC Chair Mark Ryan, Town Counsel Karis North advised the NAC that “In her opinion, the certificate of insurance provided by BEH meets the requirements

rective action plan to stop further problems at the airport, as dictated by the Federal Aviation Administration’s (FAA) Part 16 Complaint process.

The Part 16 Complaint alleged the NAC violated federal grant assurances and had engaged in “discriminatory and exclusionary practices.” The FAA agreed.

Also as part of complying with the settlement, the NAC voted on three subjects of the agreement. First, the NAC voted to back BEH’s request to

an official FBO.

“We certainly welcome you and look forward to you running your business,” he said. “You are fully licensed and good to go at anytime.”

Also during the meeting, Mazzucco introduced two new lawyers from the firm Anderson Krieger. The pair is designated now as part of the Town Counsel team, and, according to Mazzucco, will be a resource designated for use by the Norwood Airport and the Norwood Airport Commis-

set forth.”

Ryan added that the insurance was consistent with the insurance previously provided by BEH. BEH is now authorized to store and sell fuel on their property. The permit for FBO status goes until 2020.

The granting of the FBO is part of the case the Town of Norwood has agreed to settle at a July 30 court hearing at the Federal Joseph Moakley Courthouse in South Boston. The settlement, now agreed to but not fully implemented, would grant BEH \$750,000 from the Town, negate any question of easements for BEH competitor and current FBO Flight Level, and allow oversight for BEH while the NAC produces a cor-

the FAA for the removal of a taxiway and taxilane object-free area (TOFA).

“The NAC is prepared to send a letter to support that position,” Ryan said.

Second, the NAC voted to send a letter of support to the FAA to support the construction of a hanger on the West Apron by BEH. The third vote confirmed that the NAC would “welcomes suggestions and would be more than happy to send them to the FAA” for the return of use to aeronautical purposes of the Verizon land at the Airport, which was found to be illegal according to the FAA.

Town Manager Tony Mazzucco welcomed BEH as

Forbes deal delayed, but both sides still confident

While both representatives from the Town of Norwood and Dr. Roberto Feliz say there are no outstanding roadblocks to the current deal for the Forbes Hill Mansion property, getting all those i’s dotted and t’s crossed is taking more time than initially thought.

Town Manager Tony Mazzucco said this is a huge operation, and Feliz is putting together \$250 million in financing for what is planned to become the Medical City of Norwood. Feliz has already put down \$500,000 as a non-refundable deposit on the \$13 million purchase of the property (which is contingent on Feliz’s financial backers agreeing).

“We extended the closing on Forbes another 60 days,” he said. “There’s an enormous amount of due diligence from the buyer’s financiers on a project like this since the financing is wrapped in his overall project, so it just takes time.”

Feliz and Mazzucco said

they have been meeting or taking conference calls every week to get this done. Feliz himself said he’s already started work on the design of the property, and expects the finalized deal to come through in a few days.

“The only thing worrying people is that the land needs to be appraised,” he said. “We ordered it to be appraised two weeks ago and once that goes through, which I believe should be in the next few days, we’re ready to move. The funding is there, everything is waiting on the final appraisal and then we’re ready to take the next step.”

Feliz said he will be show-

Norwood Fire collecting to "Fill the Boot"

The Fill the Boot campaign started in 1952 in Boston by Firefighter Charles Crowley to help his two sons battle Duchenne muscular dystrophy.

Crowley started by asking his fellow firefighters for help, and his good friend George Graney asked 20 of his fellow firefighters to go door to door asking for donations, raising \$5,000 (in 1950s money mind you) for Crowley's sons.

Now, the tradition has taken root in Norwood. According to Firefighter and Boot Campaign organizer Paul Ronco, the fundraiser has been a part of the Norwood Fire Department before he even got there.

"We've got a guy who has been collecting since he started, and he's been here for 40 years," he said. "He was 18 when he signed on; you know he was very young."

The donations in Norwood go directly to the Muscular Dystrophy Association, which funds treatment and research for the disease. Muscular dystrophy is a group of diseases that cause progressive weakness and loss of muscle mass over time. Depending on the type of disease, symptoms can start in early childhood or mid adulthood and there is no cure.

Ronco said Norwood Firefighters set up shop and collect in several locations throughout Town.

"We're going to do it this Saturday, Sunday and Monday, and we might put another weekend on, depending on whether we hit our goal or not," he said. "Right now we're looking to do \$6,000. Last year, we were able to collect \$5,000, and so now it's

time to step up our game a little bit."

Firefighters will be out and about at the Dunkin' Donuts on Nahatan Street, the Shaw's Supermarket and the Stop and Shop Supermarket this weekend. Ronco said he's been organizing the collections for some time now, and he loves helping where he can.

"This is my 25th year collecting," he said. "I absolutely love it because we've got some families in Norwood who are affected by muscular dystrophy and we do a road race specifically for one of the kids here too every year. I've also been involved with the Muscular Dystrophy Association and I've gone to their summer camps and it's amazing... Everything seems to be a struggle for these kids, but at the summer camps, they all have smiles on their faces."

Ronco said this past weekend's collection put them at good numbers but they are looking to replicate that suc-

cess this weekend.

"We raised almost \$2,300 just Saturday and Sunday," he said.

The Fill the Boot campaign had local roots, but now has swept the nation from Hawaii to Houston. The International Association of Firefighters (IAFF) supports the cause, and national donations can be made at filltheboot.donordrive.com.

ConCom talks billboards, signs

The Norwood Conservation Commission (NCC) approved a change of a sign at 500 Providence Hwy. from a standard static billboard to a digital billboard.

The Norwood Zoning Board of Appeals already approved the change request through a special permit, but the NCC needed to approve it because the work area needed to change the sign would abut wetlands. Attorney David Hern represented Clear Channel Outdoor.

Hern said they would replace the current structure which has several supports with

concrete bases to a singular support. Architect Josh White from JK Holmgren Engineering went over the construction plan in how it relates to the wetlands in the area.

White said the proposed "monopole" billboard would be sited outside the 25-foot buffer zone the Town requires, but he said the original structure is within that zone (the monopole's construction allows it to be further away than the existing multi-support structure currently there).

"We pushed it as far away from the wetland as we could," he said. "We located it off the edge of the pavement. It's a steep slope off the parking lot, so we located it about five feet

off of the pavement."

He said they would use a landscaped area to the west of the actual site to store construction material and would use a Bobcat earth mover to do most of the work.


"And basically hand labor to clear brush, because we originally proposed to leave the existing concrete footings in place to minimize the impact, but when I talked to (Norwood Conservation Agent Al Goetz), he mentioned he would like us to remove those," he said. "So that's what we're doing."

White said the monopole will be a three-foot in diameter pipe filled later with concrete.

Goetz said he still had a few issues with the proposal, as it is in close proximity to the Norwood Country Club, the Norwood Airport and the coming Skating Club of Boston. He said he was concerned about the soil, since the excavation of the site for the skating club took out a great deal of peat soil.

“A monopole sitting on a bunch of peat soil wouldn’t be such a good idea,” he said.

Vice President of Real Estate and Public Affairs for Clear Channel Michael Morello said the foundation will be filled with concrete to keep the sign stable. The three-foot pole

would be surrounded by concrete.

Also at the meeting, the Commission discussed property signage. Members said they wanted to iron out some details of some of the existing signage, particularly the small use sign going into Ellis Pond. The commission agreed it’s not in a good location.

“No one reads that sign,” said member Peter Bamber.

The sign details what can be done and what is prohibited at the pond. Bamber and the Commission agreed it should be closer to the parking area. Goetz said they should have the

same sign at all Conservation properties.

“Any of the properties that have similar issues certainly,” Bamber said.

Member Cheryl Doyle said she would discuss it with the Norwood Department of Public Works on moving the sign.

The Commission also discussed graffiti on the Willett Pond Sign.

“It’s not much though,” said member John Gear. “I think someone with the right kind of paint could just go up there and touch it up. I don’t think it’s worth taking it down and bringing it somewhere.”

ing the Town the design of the city through public meetings in the coming months and will have a groundbreaking ceremony once all dots and crosses are applied to their appropriate i's and t's.

Feliz has two pain management clinics, one in Hyde Park and one in North Andover, and is a board certified pain management physician and anesthesiologist, and is originally from the Dominican Republic. He worked to get his medical degree at Dartmouth Medical School and completed his residency at Harvard Medical School at Beth Israel Hospital. He also currently serves as an impartial physician for the Massachusetts Workers' Compensation Judges.

Feliz said he wants people to think of Norwood first when they think of medical care once the Medical City is in place.

"You know, if you go to Patriot Place, your first thought is football, and if you think football, your first thought is Patriot Place," he said. "If you need healthcare, you go to the Medical City of Norwood."

Feliz added the Town has been working hard with him to get the deal closed.

"The Town is really, really pushing to close," he said. "I have no incidents with them, but when you're trying to put together a \$250 million deal, it takes time. Every T has to be crossed. Tomorrow I have Blue Bell International coming in to go around the Town and the property, and I think everything is going to be fine."

Feliz said he will have as much information on the final design as possible once the deal is finalized.

"We're also looking to keep as many of the trees around the property, we're very committed to that," he said. "We're going to make this city happen."


