## Tensions at Airport Commission lead to court complaint

Allegations of assault made at Chairman Wynne

The Norwood Airport Commission, which has recently had several tense discussions with one of its tenants, now appears to be in the midst of internal struggles.

According to a police report filed June 24, Airport Commissioner Oulton Hues, Jr. contends that, in a meeting on June 23, Airport Commission Chairman Thomas Wynne threw a stack of papers with a paperclip, which struck him in the head.

"[Thomas] Wynne called me on the phone and asked me on the phone specifically to meet with himself and [Vice Chair of the Airport Commission and Department of Public Works Director] Mark Ryan on Monday," said Hues. "Basically, what we were supposed to talk about was some e-mails that I sent voicing some of my concerns ... at a certain point in the conversation — Mr. Wynne, I guess he lost his cool, and threw a stack of papers at me from across the table."

The report also states that a police officer visited Wynne's house and asked about the incident. Wynne reported to the officer that he tossed a small stack of papers with a paperclip onto the table, which then bounced onto the floor.

Commissioner Paul Shaughnessy Jr., who was also at the meeting, has submitted a witness statement to the Board

of Selectmen (BOS) about the incident.

"I observed questioning and answering between the three parties and at 12:15 p.m., Mr. Wynne [stood] at the conference table three feet from Mr. Hues [and] picked up off the conference table one 56 page white office paper bundle ... and [threw] it with [a] right hand over swing, violently hitting Mr. Hues in the back left side of his head," said Shaughnessy in his statement.

Hues filed his own statement to the BOS.

"I know that Airport Commission Meetings can be a hostile environment, but I never thought that they would progress to a physical level. Never before have

I ever encountered such unprofessional behavior in a professional setting," said Hues in his statement.

Wynne did not return several requests for a statement, but Ryan said that Hues' version of the incident is wrong.

"There's not much I can tell you ... the only comment I can give you is that the allegations by Mr. Hues are totally false," said Ryan, limiting his statements because of the pending legal recourse.

Hues has since filed a complaint in Dedham District Court.

According to Hues, the small meeting was called over several issues he raised concerning a larger disagreement between the Airport Commission and its

# Vandalism at Highland Cemetery

Several veterans' graves were disturbed at the end of June in what appears to have been a botched robbery of bronze flag holders.

"I was doing rounds and I noticed a stack underneath a tree of these [holders], initially what I did was call the police," said Highland Cemetery Foreman Paul Ranalli. "In the 15 minutes it took police to respond, I noticed another stack behind the chapel. Obviously, they are smart enough to know it's the old sections of the cemetery that have the holders."

The flag holders were found on the morning of June 27. Police then took the flag holders to the station as evidence and are still currently investigating the incident. In all, around 40 of the decorations were removed from gravesites.

"The thought was they were going to scrap them, but they must have gotten spooked," said Superintendent of the Department of Public Works (DPW) Mark Ryan when speculating on the reason for the robbery.

Unfortunately, added Ryan, this isn't the first time a robbery like this has been attempted.

"This happened a couple of years ago too where the thieves would scrap them," said Ryan.

Ranalli said that he discovered the past robbery when he noticed flags were stuck in the ground with the holders gone.

types of markers is prohibitive.

Ranalli added that it was a tough situation because of the advanced age of the graves, and that they may not have as many visitors as they once did.

"You have people who just come up on Memorial Day, say they live out of state, that's when you really have an influx," said Ranalli of when people notice a flag holder is missing.

Ranalli said his staff is doing its best to find the graves with missing flag holders and replace them with plastic ones.

"Police have the [bronze] holders right now ... normally they are replaced with plastic holders," said Ranalli. "I would love to eventually replace them with the [removed] bronze holders but we're not sure which markers they were and what conditions they are in."

Ranalli said that the bronze markers were mostly used to designate the graves of WWI and WWII veterans, and that they were at the cemetery long before his time.

Highland Cemetery, which was established in 1880, doesn't replace the bronze markers with metal ones because the cost of these

# DPW and Rec. Dept. team up to complete Coakley walking path

In a project that received the full support of the Board of Selectmen, the Department of Public Works (DPW) and Recreation Department (Rec. Dept.) plan to complete the public walking loop behind the Coakley Middle School.

DPW Director and Town Engineer Mark Ryan and Superintendent of the Rec. Dept. Gerald Miller presented the project to the Board Tuesday night.

Ryan reported that the project began several years ago when the town voiced the need for more walking paths in town. The track currently is around 80 percent complete and connects the several baseball fields located behind the middle school.

Ryan continued that the portion left to be completed is around 600 feet long and will take approximately three to four weeks to complete. The cost, Ryan added, would be less than \$10,000 and would come from current Rec. Dept. and DPW budgets. The materials for the project will be provided by the DPW.

"I've noticed people my age using it," said Ryan. "We both feel it would be a great asset to the community."

Selectman Paul Bishop responded that it would be a shame to not complete the project and commended the officials for being able to complete the project without outside funding.

Selectman Bill Plasko added that he uses the path himself and that completing the loop would make it safer for residents to complete the loop.

"I think you did a great job on this," said Selectman Allan Howard.

In what may be a positive sign for the economic recovery of downtown Norwood, the Selectmen also approved

a Junk Dealers License for Chelala Jewelry and Gifts. The applicant, Pascale Chelala, has operated a jewelry store for over 20 years at the Walpole Mall, and will open a new location at 696 Washington St.

The new store will replace Hill's Jewelers, which had occupied the location for 32 years before filing for bankruptcy earlier this year. Many residents and town officials pointed to Hill's closing as an example of an economically ailing downtown Norwood and another unfortunate vacancy on Washington Street.

"We have to get going on filling our [down]town area. It's an urgent priority," said Howard at the time. "[Hill's Jewelers closing] is just another example of how urgent getting retail operations in that [area] is. It's not looking good with so many vacancies."

The Selectmen praised the applicant for venturing to open a jewelry store in Norwood.

"This is good for the town and will fill a void," said Bishop.

Howard added that Tom Cummings, who hosts a show called "Inside Norwood" on NPATV, is offering a 15-minute segment of his show to new businesses coming to Norwood to discuss their venture. Chelala said that she would love to take advantage of the opportunity.

Cummings' effort to promote business in the downtown mirrors efforts town officials have made in order to help economically bolster the downtown area this year.

In June, an open meeting to discuss the downtown was held for business owners, property owners and the public. Though solutions varied, optimism shone through with mention of several new tenants interested in the vacant storefronts downtown.

Another effort to help the downtown businesses is the promotion and call for participation in the Farmers' Market that takes place on the Town Common on Tuesdays. Farmers' Market Manager Laurie Shea is trying to push a community information table for local restaurants to leave their menus and to help local businesses promote themselves.

"We want to really try and have more of a community feel at this event," said Shea. "It's something we really want to promote. I walked up town myself and went to the businesses ... any local businesses can leave information. That way people can peruse that table and see what the town has to offer."

Finally, the Selectmen wanted to inform the public that the deadline for applying to the Boch Fund is Thursday, July 17. The \$30,500 fund is an annual gift from the Andrew and Ernest J. Boch Memorial that helps a variety of Norwood's civic and charitable organizations. Last year, the funds helped many of Norwood High School's athletic teams, American Legion Baseball and a number of charities like Norwood's Meals on Wheels and the Ecumenical Food Pantry.

tenant, Boston Executive Helicopter (BEH).

Chris Donovan, president of BEH and the company's counsel, Joshua Fox, have appeared before the Commission several times about their ongoing construction of a fueling station and hangar as well as their interest in expanding operations at the airport. BEH is interested in becoming a second fuel provider at the airport, but say they need more space on the apron and airplane parking areas to do so.

The Commission has not yet made a determination on leasing the amount of land that BEH is requesting, and is looking for more financial information from the company. The Commission has also stated it would be interested in doing a financial and feasibility study of the area BEH is interested in, which is called the west ramp. According to Donovan, the west ramp currently has 100,000 square feet that can be leased. The Commission offered a 6,000 square foot parcel of the land to BEH, but the offer was rescinded when it wasn't ac-

cepted by BEH.

The Board of Selectmen has also looked into the dispute between BEH and the airport, and added four more members to the Airport Commission in an attempt to help resolve the issue. The addition of Michael Sheehan, Hydie Hutchens, Paul Shaughnessy, Jr. and Oulton Hues, Jr. brings the Commission's total membership to nine.

Among the latest allegations that have come against the Airport commission is an accusation of economic discrimination.

A Part 13 complaint regarding economic discrimination was filed with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) against the Airport commission. The complaint was referenced without being discussed or named at the June Airport Commission Meeting.

"There was an article in the Norwood Record that talked about the Part 13 complaint filed with the FAA by one of the airport's tenants ... as an Airport Commissioner I have not formally been made aware of the complaint," said Hues of the issues he raised, prompting the small meeting. "And I know that [Airport Manager Russ Maguire] received a letter from the FAA, dated the fifth of June with the nature and the details of the complaint ... why wasn't that addressed at the [June 11] meeting? I would think that would be of importance. We receive millions of dollars of funding from the FAA, which they are obligated to

grant assurances."

Hues said when he asked about the Part 13 complaint not being addressed during the meeting, he was told that it was because of the time in which the letter came in.

"Also, I'm aware of a letter from the Massachusetts Department of Records Division from May, I believe May 27, addressed to Russ Maguire ... and stated his failure to maintain records. That wasn't brought up at either meeting, the May or the June meeting. I consider these to be some issues," said Hues.

The letter Hues referred to is from the Secretary of the Commonwealth's Public Records Division. It was sent in response to BEH's request for a tape of the April Airport Commission Meeting, which was denied. The Commission claims to have deleted the tape before the request.

"Although the Commission had not received a request for this recording at the time it was deleted, its failure to properly maintain this record raises concerns regarding its records management practices," said Shawn A. Williams, Supervisor of Records, in the letter.

Hues said that he is frustrated with the behavior of the Airport Commission and the Norwood Airport officials.

"I hope to bring about positive change and it's hard when people don't give you what's required of them," said Hues.

The July Commission meeting has not yet been scheduled.

## George Lally is the face of baseball in Norwood

It's no secret that Norwood is a baseball town, one that lives and breathes a passion for the game. But one resident might just embody that enthusiasm more than most.

George Lally, who was born in South Boston but came to Norwood in 1979, is a senior international board member and historian for Babe Ruth League, Inc., the largest regulation youth baseball program in the world.

Though he was unable to make the Babe Ruth team as a teenager, Lally has been involved in just about every other aspect of the game — as a coach, umpire, vice president, president, and commissioner, among other positions — since 1962.

"I have for many years put more hours into Babe Ruth

than my own job. I've gotten a lot more from baseball than I could ever give," said Lally.

As such, Lally has become a treasure trove of knowledge about the organization and the game, not only in Norwood, but all around the world. He even has a "Babe Ruth League room" at home.

Throughout his travels, Lally has had the pleasure of meeting many professional ball players and figureheads of the game, including former Yankee and American League president, Dr. Bobby Brown, George Foster, and Babe Ruth's wife, Claire.

"There's been a lot of elite people and players, but 99 percent of these kids are elite because they become better citizens," Lally said.

"They give something back to the program wherever they may be. They help future kids coming behind them participate and be a

part of something in the great game of baseball."

Lally even met his wife at a Babe Ruth League state tournament and one of his sons turned down a scholarship from American University to attend the University of Notre Dame, a place he fell in love with during a Babe Ruth tournament.

But if there's a ground zero for Lally's love of youth baseball, it's certainly Norwood.

Lally credits the whole town, from General Manager John Carroll to the folks who maintain the fields, for making Norwood a renowned and successful baseball community, responsible for producing well-rounded youth.

"Norwood offers the great American dream," Lally said.

For Lally, it's the people of Norwood in particular who embody the mission of the Babe Ruth League: to have fun,

doubleheader on July 2 and needed to win in order to avoid slipping further out of contention.

John Ryan got the start for Norwood in the 5:45 p.m. game against Franklin and was solid in a complete game effort. Franklin opened the scoring in the fourth, as Ryan let up back-to-back hits to start the inning, before an RBI grounder put Franklin up 1-0. Ryan responded by striking out the next two batters to end the inning.

Norwood Aquatics Club's youth swim team, the Stingrays, began its competitive season on July 1 against Needham with a 252-181 away loss at Rosemary pool.

Despite the overall score, many Norwood swimmers turned in exceptional results to start their season.

At the senior level, Norwood's 15-18 year-olds were outnumbered, but managed to snag a few top three finishes. Julia Kiley, Shannon Carey, and Shannon Bonner, representing the senior Norwood girls, took top finishes, while Ben Kerns, Brendan Hurley, and Manny Escobar were strong on the boys' side.

"Overall, the swimmers swam

well, given it is their first meet of the season, we had a small squad, we were away, and have only had four practices," said Stingrays coach Kimberly Miller. "There is plenty of room for improvement over the next seven weeks. Much of our focus will be on developing better technique, increasing endurance a bit more and working on sprinting."

Isabelle Antonitis, Grace Gillis, Bridget Roach, and Mikayla Jordan each had top three finishes in the 13-14 girls races. In the 11 and 12 year-old bracket, Norwood received top three finishes from Shayla Keady, Mary Lee, Alexandra Bedard, Hannah Madeya, Robin Jones, Michael Scuderi and Matt Bonner.

The nine and 10 year-old Stingrays turned in some of the best results for Norwood, with Olivia Bedard, Flannery Miller, Hannah Abrahams, Mikhaila Hurley, Coleman Keady, Aidan Hurley, Jacob Bodenhofer and Ryan Kelly all earning top three results.

For many races at the eight and under level, Norwood swimmers largely competed against their own ranks, as Needham did not field as many younger swimmers. Sarah McCarey, Charlotte McDonald and Charlotte Mathews earned top three finishes on the girls' side and Brendan Jordan, Thomas Dearborn and Thomas Lynch earned the same on the boys' side.

For Miller, these results were encouraging, especially for an

away season opener preceded by only four team practices.

"Away meets are not as well attended as home meets, especially away meets that are in ponds or in Needham's case, a pool that is next to a pond and is 50 meters long," Miller said.

Miller also mentioned that the summer season can be challenging because of the wide variety of swimming venues: ponds, pools next to ponds, pools of varying lengths, etc.

"Home court, or in this case, pool advantage definitely comes into play. I know it does for our swimmers when we swim at Hawes," Miller said. "During the winter, we swim in all 25 yard pools, so it makes comparing your times and swimmer improvements a bit easier."

Norwood sent 58 of its over 180 swimmers against a much smaller, but older, Needham squad. Needham has more swimmers aged 13 and older, whereas Norwood relies on a large base of 12 and under swimmers. All races for swimmers aged 10 and under are 25 yards, while the 11 and over swimmers race for 50 yards.

The Stingrays' next meet takes place on July 8 against Sherborn. A home meet, the event will take place at Hawes Pool on Washington Street in Norwood, beginning at 6 p.m. Two days later, the Stingrays will face Walpole at Center Pool on July 10 at 6 p.m.
