## Norwood celebrates the Fourth

Thousands came out to Norwood on July 4 to celebrate the Nation's Independence Day.

The day started with the Children's Bicycle, Tricycle doll Carriage and Historical Character Parade, and then proceeded with the Tour of the Old Parish Cemetery, the Carillon Concert, the Norwood Firecracker 5K and ended with the Fourth of July Parade Spectacular.

The weather was ex-

tremely cooperative as residents lined up for the parade. Town Manager Tony Mazzucco spoke during the parade to kick off the celebration.

"It's a great parade as always, and I think, for me, the best part is coming up the street right now, so we're going to give a good listen to the Colonial Boys, and happy Fourth of July everyone," he said.

The Norwood Colonial Boys Fife and Drum Corps have been a tradition for more than 60 years. The group plays around the world and has a repertoire of traditional Irish and American songs, often from the Revolutionary and Civil

War eras.

Residents said coming out for the Fourth is just another perk of being in Norwood.

"We've been here seven years and we usually do this every year," said resident Karina Pinero. "The first time, we were new to Town and it was just the biggest celebration, saving for Norwood Day. We wanted to be part of the Town and we made it a tradition to come every year. It seems to get better every year, more runners and more volunteers."

Resident Shelley Sullivan said

# Board of Health approves new vaping/tobacco regulations

Recently, the Norwood Board of Health voted unanimously to approve several new vaping and tobacco product regulations in the Town of Norwood.

Those new regulations include prohibiting the sale of all flavored tobacco products, including mint and menthol, in all retail tobacco stores, including adult-only store retail tobacco stores, restricting all smoke accessories, including vaping products to adult-only tobacco retail stores, and capping the number of adult-only retail tobacco stores at two.

The adult-only retail tobacco retail store cap went into effect on June 27 and the other two regulations are set to take effect on Sept. 15.

"The whole point of the policy is to reduce youth use rates," said Health Department Director Sigalle Reiss. "We saw a 150 percent increase in vaping rates in the Middle School. This policy is one piece of a large puzzle that we as a community can take to help reduce substance use. The schools and parents are also involved in educating and protecting our youth from substances,

and this policy will work to help reduce access and reduce exposure to vaping and flavored products."

Reiss did say in previous Board of Health meetings that this would only help to reduce local access to vape products and accessories, since a multitude of web sites allow residents to mail order said products.

"We are fortunate to have strong leaders on the Board of Health, Kathleen Bishop, Joan Jacobs and Carolyn Riccardi. The Board members understand the adolescent brain is like a pot of boiling water and the more we can do to reduce the temperature the better outcomes we can provide for Norwood's youth. Reducing access and exposure to vaping and flavored products turns down the temperature and creates a healthier community."

Reiss said they took a good deal of testimony from the public to arrive at this decision.

"The Board of Health takes public input very seriously and went above and beyond what is required by law to gather input from stakeholders," she said. "They heard and received written testimony from parents, school officials, law enforcement and local tobacco retailers. They weighted all the information and voted on regulations."

But Vape Daddy's owner David Bershad said his dedicated 21-plus adult vape store in Norwood would lose a lot of business, enough to make him consider shutting down his four store operation.

"It's going to put us out of business," he said. "Our sales in Norwood are pretty significant when you look at who is in the area, it's a major loss of revenue for us."

Bershad said he's currently fighting to keep flavored vape liquids or "juices" as he calls them because it's a major part of daily business.

"Something like 88 percent of all the juice we sell is considered flavored, and about 70 percent of what we sell is juice and when the juice sales go down the hardware sales go down too, and then it's over," he said.

He said he disagrees with the Board's decision to not allow a dedicated store like Vape Daddy's to sell the flavored juice in the first place.

"I mean adolescents are going to push the envelope no matter what, and that's not an excuse, but do you think that if you hold it out further they're not going to go for it?" he

# Selectmen hear about job resources, discuss cemetery, Common operations

A two-and-a-half-hour Selectmen's meeting on Tuesday, July 9 included a presentation from a MassHire representative, three public hearings, and other town business items.

Greg Bunn, executive director of the MassHire Metro South/West Workforce Board, explained how the organization helps those who have lost jobs get training, gain job seeking skills, and find new jobs. Support for these programs is tied to the unemployment rate which in the area is down to 2.4 percent.

"We are the victim of our own success," Nunn said, but the two Norwood career centers continue to offer resume assistance, workshops, and other support services. Over 400 Norwood residents have visited the centers in the past year. "We have a robust youth program," Bunn noted, including a partnership with Norwood High School, seeking out youths who are unemployed, focusing on career exploration services for freshmen and sophomores while developing experiential learning activities, including paid internships, for juniors and seniors. More than 64 students have participated in the program. Bunn encouraged anyone who would like to look at job opportunities to go to 32 Day Street to check out what is available. MASSHIRE's efforts were lauded. "I want to thank you for everything you've done for the Town of Norwood," said Selectman Allan Howard.

A lengthy discussion ensued over areas that Selectman David Hajjar was tasked to explore. Hajjar stated that he has examined current cemetery fees along with Mark Ryan, Director of Norwood's DPW.

"Our goal is to make the cemetery operation as close to self-sustaining as possible," he said. The perpetual care account has over \$500,000, but only the interest from the ac-

count can be used. Hajjar made several recommendations to generate revenue through increased fees for sustainability. Selectmen, however, expressed skepticism.

"We aren't a car dealer, raising our prices every year," said Howard, who cautioned against raising prices frequently. Selectman William Plasko questioned how fees are set and collected. It was determined that more time was needed to review the recommendations and related documents. The Town Common and Bandstand Rules and Regulations were also debated but no vote taken on the entire document, leaving Hajjar to make additional updates and return with a new document for review.

During the first public hearing Adam Heller from Siena Engineering requested permission to install an underground connection between two telecommunication conduits at the intersection of Nahatan and Pleasant streets, creating a direct underground path between existing utility poles.

"How long do you estimate that you would be at the intersection of Nahatan and Pleasant," asked Howard. Heller replied one day, though it will take two weeks of work to complete the entire project. The request was approved unanimously. The second public hearing was a petition from Barbara Kelleher representing National Grid to install and maintain a gas main to Pleasant Street from the existing gas main at Sunset Avenue, southerly to Morse St. and a gas main from Morse Street to the intersection of Pleasant Street, westerly to building #83. This would provide gas services in The Norwood Industrial Park. The request was approved with recommendations. The third public hearing was a request by Mohamed Elalfy of 60 Winslow Ave. for a Class II Used Auto Dealer License. This is a home business conducted entirely online with no cars to be stored at the home

or on the street. Three abutters in attendance raised opposition to granting the license but were assured that this would not affect street traffic or parking. The request was approved after clarification that no purchased cars would appear on the premises.

A show cause hearing was also held regarding an incident at Jake n JOES, at 475 Boston Providence Turnpike, involving an alcoholic beverage served to a 17-year-old. The vertical scanner was not used in reading the ID. The bartender is no longer employed by the restaurant and vigorous employee training is now in place. Selectmen voted on issuing a verbal warning as this was the first offense by the restaurant in its nine years. "I feel comfortable that they are doing consistent training throughout the year," said Hajjar.

Other business included approvals for C.V. (Common Victualer) licenses issued to establishments that prepare food and serve on the premise to Norwood Center Pizza & Grille and New England Authentic Eats LLC., dba Papa Gino's & D'Angelo.

# Town welcomes new recruits!

The Town of Norwood is welcoming in six newly-hired recruits for the Police and Fire Departments. Robert Stanton and Jacob Ryan were hired as police officers, and will start at the Academy on July 8, and Brian Bettencourt, Ryan Greeley, Charles "CJ" Kuietauskas and Adam Kewriga were hired as firefighters, and began work on Monday.

Stanton graduated from Suffolk University with a bachelor's in sociology and philosophy, and previously worked with the Norfolk County Sheriff's office in Dedham. Ryan graduated with an associate's from Massasoit and worked for three years as a dispatcher for the Walpole Police Department.

Bettencourt, as well as Greeley and Kuietauskas, worked with the Brewster Ambulance Service for one year, and graduated from Fitchburg State University. Greeley, who comes from a family of firefighters and is the first to work for Norwood Fire, graduated from the University of Massachusetts Amherst in 2017. Kuietauskas, whose family owns the Norwood Sport Center, was in the United States Marine Corps for six years as a machine gunner. Kewriga was a part of the US Military for six years as a medical corpsman after graduating from the Norwood High

School in 2011. They all describe themselves as motivated and hard-working, and look forward to helping the people of Norwood.

"People don't call 911 on their best days," Stanton says, and further adds how it is his responsibility to be there for them in those hard times. # Airport Commission reviews proposal from Flight Level

The Norwood Airport Commission met last week on July 2 and discussed several issues, voting to approve a lease for Flight Level Lots A, B, and C, pending approval from the Town's Purchasing Clerk.

Commission Chair Mark Ryan said the lots are out by the Control Tower area, totaling about 95,000 square feet. The original request for proposal (RFP) asked for proposals to construct a 7,000 square-foot hanger. There was one submittal, from Flight Level, and a letter from Boston Executive Helicopters (BEH) General Manager Christopher Donovan (who was also recording at the meeting) with 27 questions about the

RFP. However, no proposal was submitted by BEH.

Flight Level's President and CEO Peter Eichleay came in to talk about the proposal.

"As you know, we've been here for several years, I believe we're in our 12th or 13th year of operating at the Norwood Airport," Eichleay said. "We've since built a team and expanded to several different airports."

Eichleay said they operate in nine airports but the flagship location and headquarters location is still Norwood. He said they want to grow and develop a new hanger there. He said they want to utilize "modern materials" for the new hanger and also install roof solar panels.

"We'll be using high-efficiency LED lighting, we'll be installing energy efficient

hanger doors. The doors will be 20 feet tall according to our design so we could accommodate some of the larger mid-size category jets," he said.

Eichleay said construction would be complete at the latest in early 2020.

"We want to move right away and we definitely have customers that want to move in there," he said.

Eichleay said right now they are pretty much running at full-occupancy for their hangers. Their tenants include Fox 25 and Channel 10 helicopters.

"Which often fly nearly every day, often at a moment's notice," he said.

Eichleay said that from where they are hangered now, those helicopters have to be towed on a dolly out to the heli-

copter runway circle, which eats up valuable time for the news teams.

"It's north of five minutes from start to finish before they get airborne, so the idea would be to move them to the new hanger, given that it's essentially next door to the heli circles from which they would be launching," he said. "So it resolves their response time issue and it also cleans up our ramps."

Eichleay said they sometimes cut right through the main transit ramp or go around, clogging up other traffic in the airport.

"Just from an operational ef-

ficiency perspective we would welcome not having to deal with that traffic on a regular basis while we're marshaling in our normal transient customers," he said.

Eichleay said this would also allow them to house more aircraft, including their new client Southern Airways, which means more business for the company.

"And all that means more business, more jobs, more maintenance work for us. We're maintaining the aircraft; we're going to need more line techs and customer service people so

## NJWC donates \$1,500 to Norwood Parks

The Norwood Junior Women's Club (NJWC) made its third donation to the Norwood Parks and Recreation Department on Tuesday night as the group hosted its first Concert on the Common.

Vanessa and the Jumping Monkeys were tuning up as NJWC President Michelle Folan presented the check to Parks Superintendent Travis Farley.

"Each summer we organize this children's summer concert series with the help of general sponsors," she said.

Farley said the funds help families in need at the Norwood Civic Center to pay for programs they might not normally be able to afford.

"We were able to help 15

families last year that needed financial aid for the program," he said.

Farley said each year is different, as more or fewer families might apply for the aid, so they don't know yet exactly how many families they will help with this money from the NJWC.

"It differs from year to year, some years we have more, some years we have less, but when we're doing more programming it tends to be a bit more," he said.

Folan said, "We've been doing this for three years and we had found through experience with our members and other kids who were taking classes some had trouble paying for it and we thought it would be a good way to give back to our community," Folan said.

NJWC member Emily Buffum said they wanted to be able to do the most good for the

most people.

"We didn't want to just do one sport or one thing, we wanted to help kids who wanted to do dance or music or art and not just be like the sports groups, because we know a lot of the sports groups have dedicated scholarships," she said. "Also, we choose not to be involved with the distribution of who gets money for what. If it was one of our parents applying we wouldn't know so there's no conflict of interest. That's why we chose to work with the Civic Center and the Recreation department. They tell us how many families need help and sometimes they'll tell us there were a lot of dancers or students in the art programs, but we don't know anything more than that."

Folan said this particular

it's all positive developments for the airport," he said, adding that they are also looking for a license to buy and sell aircraft.

Vice Chair Michael Sheehan said he wanted reassurance from the Town's Purchasing Clerk Mary O'Brien that all the plans were in order for the proposal, for which the Commission agreed. Sheehan and several other commissioners voiced their support for the proposal as well.

Eichleay said they want to support a possible extension to one of the runways at the Norwood Airport so that they could cater to bigger clients in the future.

"I'm convinced that we could become a legit competitor to Bedford, to a lesser extent maybe Beverly, but I think the airport would really soar if you added 5,001-foot runway that would give the heavier armor another option," he said.

Ryan also brought up an ongoing issue with the car rental service AVIS at the airport. Members of the Commission have been counting cars and found that from May 31 to June 19, they were averaging seven cars a day outside of their assigned spaces. He also said they found unregistered and unlicensed vehicles on the premises.

"I think we might want to consider talking with AVIS. Since business is so great maybe they could lease some space from us," Ryan said.

Maguire said that AVIS should be informed, however, that since the lots are not designated for open lot storage (and cannot be designated as such until the one-year moratorium on open lot storage in Town is lifted), that any unregistered or unlicensed vehicles found at the lot will be towed. The Commission voted unanimously to approve such a correspondence.

asked?"

Bershad said the kids who are vaping could get the flavored juices online with a gift card, and said he has to adhere to strict inspections with the threat of citations from the Town, the State and Federal secret shoppers.

"I know this because they give us paper work afterwards," he said.

Bershad admitted he didn't go to the original hearing on the matter.

"Shame on us for not going," he said.

He said he's been trying to

schedule another hearing with the Norwood Board of Health, but because of the summer schedule, the earliest date he can get is two days after the ban goes into effect on Sept. 17.

"I never say die, we're not giving up," he said.

# Ask The Doctor

Junior Damato began servicing vehicles in 1969. He owns a 10-bay auto repair service center in Hyde Park and an 8-bay center in Middleboro. Junior is an ASE-certified Master Technician, ASE-certified L-1 and ASE-certified Natural Gas.

**To the Doctor:** I have a 2001 Ford Escape 6-cylinder with 130,000 miles. I've never had a problem with it. It's been my second car for the last few years and now I put on about 100 miles a month. It's been running nicely, even as of yesterday. But today I got in the car and, when I turned the ignition on, it attempted to start and then I heard a puffing noise and an immediate smell. The car will not start now. Can you give me some idea of what I may be faced with?

**From the Doctor:** The first step is to check all sensor inputs and values. Second, take a look at the engine oil and coolant levels. The V/6 engine has been a good engine and it has a timing chain, not a timing belt, which seldom fail. Without hearing the engine, it is hard to say any more.

**To the Doctor:** I own a 2005 Toyota 4Runner with over 230,000 miles. When it gets cold outside, the check engine light as well as the VSC light comes on. Once the temperature gets over 50° they go out. There is no noticeable change in the way the vehicle rides. The codes that are in the computer are P0420, P0441 and P0455. This has been going on for a few years now. Hopefully you can give me some advice as to how to take care of this problem.

**From the Doctor:** The fault codes indicate a problem. Start with P0420 – this is a catalytic converter fault. The P0441 and P0455 indicate an EVAP leak. A simple gas cap seal, vent valve or any other valve in the system can cause these codes. Both Alldata and Identifix have information on how to test the system. On high mileage vehicles, catalytic converters do wear and fail. The use of premium gasoline that burns hotter and some catalytic converter cleaners can sometimes cure minor converter blues.
