Coakley naming forum coming up

The initiative to consider renaming the Coakley Middle School commenced earlier this spring, and the reaction from some residents could have contributed significantly to the higher-than-usual temperatures the Town experienced throughout this past summer.

Several residents started a petition to keep the Coakley named for former Superintendent Philip O. Coakley, who served the district during the 1960s. Now, the Norwood Public Schools District (NPS) is hosting a community forum to consider a new name on Tuesday, Sept. 26, at the Norwood High School Auditorium from 7 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

NPS Superintendent David

Thomson said this forum will be the last opportunity for the Norwood School Committee to hear from the community on potentially renaming the building.

"People will be allowed to speak and the committee will hear," he said. "The purpose of this will be to inform the committee as they look to the next step, which will be a vote on a name. This is where the public gets to share their thoughts on the name, and the committee gets to hear from the community."

Thomson said there will be no student vote. Originally, the School Committee was going to use the results from a public survey to narrow down the list of possible names to three and let the students going to the Coakley vote on what the name should be from those three choices.

"They took the student vote piece out of it," he said.

Thomson said the actual School Committee vote will take place either on Sept. 27 or Oct. 11, depending on the Committee's agenda moving forward. The School Committee's meeting this past Wednesday, on Sept. 13, went long and there were some items not attended to on the agenda. There was another meeting scheduled for Sept. 20, after The Record's deadline.

Former School Committee member and opponent of the name change Mark Joseph said he hopes the name remains the same.

"It's been quite a ride," he said. "I mean, I just hope everyone does their due diligence

Thomson decides not to extend contract

At the Norwood School Committee meeting last Wednesday, Sept. 13, Superintendent Dr. David Thomson announced that he will not extend his contract, making his last day June 30.

In a short speech to the committee, he reflected on his past six years at Norwood, stating that he is "incredibly proud of all the accomplishments and improvements that [they've] obtained," including the much discussed and fought-over Budget Override in 2019.

"We successfully advocated and gained support in this community to pass the first operational override and gain financial stability to move the district forward, as well as the Town," he said.

He cited financial improvements, a reestablishment of trust in town leadership, data advances to improve intervention instruction, the conduction of an equity audit, classroom and curriculum improvements, and the creation of a critical review cycle.

Dr. Thomson said he took "personal pride" in the Prescott becoming a Blue Ribbon school and in Dr. Galligan being named 'Massachusetts's High School Principal of the Year' last year.

PROPOSAL: The proposed project extends along Canton Street from the East Street Rotary to the intersection with University Avenue (1.9 miles) and consists of constructing a shared-use path along the east side of the roadway and a sidewalk along the west side of the roadway, with high-visibility crossing opportunities,in accordance with applicable design guides. Bicyclists are intended to use the shareduse path for travel and pedestrians may walk along either side. The facilities will drop to the roadway grade over the existing bridge over the railroad tracks. These facilities will provide connections to the Downey Elementary School, the Route 128/University Park MBTA/Amtrak Station, nearby retail and restaurants, and the adjacent Currier Reservation conservation area. The Project will also incorporate traffic calming measures in an effort to reduce vehicular speeds along Canton Street, a new stormwater system, water main replacement, and relocated overhead utilities.

A secure right-of-way is necessary for this project. Acquisitions in fee and permanent or temporary easements may be required. The Town of Westwood is responsible for acquiring all needed rights in private or public lands. MassDOT's policy concerning land acquisitions will be presented in the hearing.

and at the end of the day we come to a resolution. I don't want to divide the Town, because that's not what this is about. We're building a great school system here. But I just didn't see any justification for this (name change)."

Joseph said the initiative didn't come from a call to action from residents.

While the votes for the middle school during the survey were never released, Joseph said it's telling that the Coakley Middle School made it into the top three suggested names, along with the Norwood Middle School and the Robert Fitzpatrick Middle School.

"I think right now the school committee has a lot more on their agenda with the superintendent not renewing his contract and so the priority right now is getting the most qualified superintendent to take over these schools," he

According to Senior Center Outreach Coordinator Kathleen Rooney, the event is for older residents and adult children of older residents to educate them on what to do, services avail-

able, and documents you need to have handy should an elder suddenly become incapacitated.

This does include information on end-of-life care and what you need to do to get your affairs in order. But Rooney said it's also for events you probably would never consider until they happen. The idea is to get ahead of those kinds of real-life situations so they don't become crises.

"For example if they had

surgery and upon release from the hospital, how are they going to get a wheelchair or get



Morse projects moving forward

The Morse House Subcommittee met on Wednesday, Sept. 13 at 3 p.m. in the Norwood Town Hall.

The meeting focused on two areas, the current construction plans and the initiative to get the House on the National Historic Register, which in turn would allow the project to apply for a host of funding grants.

The total \$1-million-plus project slated for the House has been split into three sections, with stabilization being the phase that Town Meeting approved this past spring for about \$200,000 (the rest of the funding for phases 2 and 3 is expected to be obtained through grants from the Registry as the years go on). The plan is to shore up the foundation, replace the windows and paint the house. Chair Bill Plasko said much of the foundation work has been done, and added that they are looking at companies to hire to do the painting and the windows.

The real concern is whether the work will be completed as per the Registry's specifications.

Plasko said he's reached out to the Registry for clarification on how to proceed, and said the Committee should continue with some of its submissions, but should hold off on others. He said members should continue with the Form B, which is kind of a current conditions inventory form. Specifically, member Toni Eosco said she has been working on it and will have it submitted soon.

But Plasko said the other form, the submission that would really kick the process into gear, is the eligibility determination and he said the Registry told him to wait until the shoring up work on the house is complete. He said, essentially, the Registry wanted to make sure the work does not affect the eligibility of the Morse House's historic character, as then they would have to send the forms twice. Many buildings currently in the Register, including the Norwood Town Hall, have to adhere to very specific building practices.

These practices are meant to keep and maintain the historic nature of the buildings, and members said they didn't have any reason to believe the work already done and slated for the building in the future would affect that.

"My feeling is that if there's any chance they were to say it's not eligible, then that would have an impact on how we do the work and whether we do the work with (Community Preservation Committee) CPC money or not," Plasko said. "If we're going to follow their standards then we can use their money, if we're not going to use their money then we'll have a whole debate over that."

Eosco said the eligibility part of the process, she believes, is fairly quick.

"It's the rest of the process that's takes time," she said.

Eosco read out and passed out the Form B to the committee, and members voted unanimously to send it to the Board of Selectmen for final approval and then to send it to the Registry.

The Committee is now looking at the painting and window restoration portions of the approved construction project. Town Manager Tony Mazzucco said the foundation work costs about \$10,000. The Committee will be meeting at the House on Oct. 2 at 9 a.m. to go over the work to be done and review the work that has been completed. This will be a public meeting, since a quorum will be present.

BOH welcomes second agent, discusses vaccines/restaurants

The Norwood Board of Health (BOH) met on Tuesday, Sept. 12, and welcomed new Health Agent Kyle Simpson to the Health Department's ranks.

Environmental Health Agent Angelo De Luca will still be performing his duties as a Sanitarian, but Simpson has been hired to lighten his load and allow the Town to more effectively inspect its many restaurants and food establishments.

"We are very lucky to have Kyle Simpson as our new Sanitarian," said Health Department Director Stacy Lane. "He's very experienced. He comes to us from Newton. He can cover all the aspects of public health and has a vast amount of experience including housing, food, and all other aspects the Health Department

is responsible for. We're very fortunate to have him, and now we have two very experienced sanitarians."

Simpson said he worked in Newton for 12 years on a team of four inspecting Newton's hundreds of restaurants.

"We had the city split up into four sections," he said. "We each had about a hundred restaurants, and so it's similar to here in the numbers."

Lane said the department had been pushing for a second agent for years now.

"We've been fighting for this for a long time, it's been a long time coming," Lane said.

The Board voted unanimously to appoint him as a health agent.

In other news, Public Health Nurse Diana Hillary said they are not giving out the bivalent booster right now, instead waiting on the new COVID-19 vaccine in a month or two. The new vaccine is currently called the "monovalent single component that corresponds with the Omicron Variant XBB15."

"We are no longer offering the bivalent booster; they are gone," she said. "The state, everybody is done with the bivalent boosters. There will be none available anywhere you go. The (Federal Drug Administration) FDA just approved the new booster, but it's still going through the process with the Guidance Committee of Immunization Practices and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). Those are the last two hurdles."

The new booster should be available, according to the John Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health Journal, by mid October.

"Once it's approved by those two committees it might



came a storm trooper legion with the nickname, "Vader's Fist." The real-world Legion has tens of thousands of members worldwide, and has even been tapped by Jon Favreau in the show "The Mandalorian" when the studio couldn't find or couldn't afford enough storm trooper costumes

"There's Disney characters, comic book characters, Batman and the like, but what's really special is the 501st," she said. "They came in 2019, and I will tell you, when they walk in with Darth Vader and all this incredible music during the entrance, all the kids and even the grown adults just stop. It's a really dramatic entrance. It's very cool."

There will be about 20 members from the local area coming to the breakfast.

"These guys are fantastic; they will come to any kind of benefit," she said. "They're really great people."



For NHS students, the Boosters will supply the costumes and students will be assigned to a particular costume.

"Years ago someone actually made the Belle costume – they were so talented – but for the most part we buy the costumes so the kids don't have to do it," she said. "What the kids are responsible for is getting into the characters they represent."

Faller said the students will act like their characters while welcoming the kids coming to the breakfast, kind of like what goes on at Disney Land and World. Faller's daughter Zoe said she will be performing Moana from the Disney film, and she will be making the stone from the movie to use as a prop. She said this worked out great back in 2019 when she and her brother were Jasmine and Aladdin when they let the children make a wish on the lamp (though no blue genie has, as of the date of publication, yet come out of the lamp to sing songs and grant said wishes).

"We had a prop, the magic lamp, and we'd tell the kids they could make a wish and rub it. It was an amazing experience just to see their faces light up," she said.

Zoe added that she and her brother got a lot of compliments on their costumes and performance.

"We kind of had that duo

down pat," Zoe said. "I think it's so heartwarming seeing the kids' faces light up when we come in. Back in 2019, I remember a kid came up to us and said, 'Oh I loved your movie.' That was touching to know that I could give someone that experience."

This year, Zoe said she is really happy to be playing Moana.

"I think she represents a lot of girl power, which sometimes you don't see a lot of in movies. I remember when I was younger and the movie came out I really loved it; her independence, strength, and the idea that anything is possible made an impact on me."

Kristen Faller said there is a setup time when the students get into character, put on makeup and do any other necessities before the show.

"We're very clear with the expectations. They have to arrive on time; they put their costumes on and go through any last minute fittings or makeup and get into character," she said. "The whole time they're there they're in character and they sign their character's name for any kids who want their autograph, and they take pictures too. They'll discuss the films when asked."


Kelleher said it will also be a good chance for residents to get out to the Space Center and see what it has to offer.

Morrill Memorial Library's own Youth Services Librarian Dina Delic and Adult Services Librarian Heath Umbreit will present "Tales from the Restricted Section," a program about the current state of book banning and censorship in America, on Thursday, October 5 at 7:00pm in the Simoni Room.

According to the American Library Association, there were 45 book challenges in Massachusetts in 2022 affecting 57 titles. That's more than the past 9 years (2013-2021) combined, which totaled 38 challenges. Nationwide, ALA reported 1,270 book challenges in 2022, up significantly from 350 in 2019.

This is an astronomical increase in censorship efforts, with ripple effects being felt in classrooms, in school and public libraries, and among families and affected youth. Challenges and censorship efforts disproportionately target books with diverse characters and/or LGBTQ+ themes. In certain parts of the country, would-be censors are threatening to fire teachers and librarians, to pull books from school library shelves, to restrict school curricula, to limit readers' access to books and other materials, and even to defund their public libraries entirely.

Join Norwood librarians Dina and Heath to learn more about how we got to this point, what kinds of books are under fire (and why), and how we can fight back against censors and book bans.
