Circle of Hope Day coming up this weekend

The annual Circle of Hope Day of Hope Carnival is kicking off this weekend at 10 a.m. at the Hawes Pool Area to celebrate Norwood and raise funds for the ever-growing charity.

The day will be filled with bouncy castles, food, games, art and the ever-popular dunk tank. Norwood Recreation Department Camp Director Rebecca Newman said the dunk tank is growing in popularity, both for those who want to throw and those who want to get dunked.

"(Norwood Recreation Department Superintendent) Travis Farley went in it last year, and we always have staff looking to go in," she said. "It looks like we're going to have good weather too, so keep your fingers crossed."

The day is designed to both raise awareness and funds for the Norwood Circle of Hope, which doles out funding for Norwood families and residents in need, no questions asked. The charity raises hundreds of thousands of dollars each year and was started by Norwood residents more than 20 years ago, originally in recognition of Michelle Kennedy.

Kennedy was a teenager battling cancer when the Town coalesced and came to her aid and, according to her mother Lee Kennedy her daughter wanted those charitable efforts to continue once she had completed her treatment. Michelle eventually lost her battle with cancer, but the charity has flourished since, and Lee Kennedy said she knows her daughter is proud of the work they've been able to do for hundreds of Norwood residents.

Kennedy said she's happy

PBCC project updates, seeks new members

The PBCC met to give updates on Town construction projects and settle some receipts in a 22-minute meeting on Thursday, July 17 at Town Hall with Ted Callahan chairing the meeting.

The Town Hall restoration project has been put on hold, according to the committee.

"As I understand it, the

OPM (Owner's Project Manager) on the project, is no longer on the project," Callahan said. "This goes back to June. The OPM was dismissed from the job, not through any fault of his. In a sense we're the OPM now."

The OPM was Vertex, he added.

The scope of the original project was only for the first

weather. It was the first time in 25 years we've ever canceled because of heat."

Cooper said the Westwood Concert Band was scheduled to perform, and they don't know if they are going to be able to reschedule. He said playing up there in the sun is, at the very least, very warm at the best of times.

"The bandstand is really hot when it's in the 80s and 90s, and it would just not have been usable," he said.

Cooper said the cooling stations the Town set up for the heat wave performed adequately.

"We had two cooling centers opened, at the Senior Center on Saturday and the

floor. However, it now encompasses the entire building. This would in effect negate the prior contract.

Bill O'Connor noted that the Town Hall project will likely have to be revisited at Town Meeting.

"We have to see what Town Meeting and the Town management decides what they want to do, to give us some direction," he said.

"There's all kinds of physical investigations that have to go through in terms of the plant," Callahan added. "I think it's going to take on a different complexion."

Norwood High School's roof will most likely receive a patch job, Callahan told the board.

"It looks like what the contractor and the manufacturer are going to do is a point of repair kind of thing," Callahan said. "There's a lot of potential there, and a lot of possibilities."

He said that another infrared study of points of leakage needs to be done, because the first one was inconclusive.

"Right now what they are doing is focused on just the gym roof, which, of course, is the real problem because that roof protects the floor," Callahan pointed out.

Callahan also explained that

the contractor is unsure about replacing the solar panels at this juncture, as they are tied into the coursework with the science department.

In other business, the final requisitions have been "delivered and paid" on the St. Gabriel's chapel restoration, according to Callahan.

"We're clear with Spillane, we're clear with Shea, and we're clear with Azur," Callahan said. This covered the construction work and the stained glass.

"The requisition for the invoice for Spillane for \$60,174.44 was split among four different accounts," O'Connor said.

O'Connor asked if OPM had been paid, as the overall contract manager. Callahan said that the company had.

"These are big books," Callahan added.

On the cemetery project, vice chair Bob Silk asked if the PBCC paid for the lawn and the hardtop.

"That was done independently by the cemetery," Callahan said, noting the cemetery also paid for the grading and the elevations. "The cemetery contracted that arrangement, and we picked up only the sod pots."

"I was up there, and it looks

beautiful," Silk added.

The invoice for the plaque for the cemetery is still forthcoming, Callahan said. It needs to be corrected.

"Now we're just talking about the nebulous stuff that needs to be cleared up," he said, referring to the smaller receipts.

Callahan made a motion for PBCC secretary Linda Clarkin to be paid to perform the accounting work necessary to close out all of the contracts for the year. It was approved 4-0.

In other important news, Silk announced that the PBCC is actively seeking new members. Candidates should have experience in architectural work, building construction or engineering. The committee meets once or twice a month on Thursday evenings at Town Hall. This is a volunteer position.

A letter of interest should be sent to Permanent Building Construction Committee, Norwood Town Hall, 566 Washington St., Norwood, MA 02062-4040.

In old business, the secretarial invoice for the meetings for June 27 and July 17, each for \$350, were approved by 4-0 votes. The minutes for the June 27 also were approved.

The next meeting to clear up old receipts is tentatively scheduled for Thursday, August 1 at 7:30 at Town Hall. The next official meeting will be held on Thursday, August 29 at 7:30 at Town Hall.

Selectmen take a hard line on liquor violations

At its meeting on Tuesday, July 23 the Board of Selectmen took tough action in dealing with establishments caught serving alcohol to minors.

The first hearing to come before the Selectmen was Castle Island Brewing Company, located at 31 Astor Avenue, accused of violating of Massachusetts General Law (MGL) C, 138, Section 34 prohibiting the delivery or furnishing of alcoholic beverages to persons under 21.

The three representatives of the company present admitted to not carefully examining the ID provided to the server by the minor. "This particular incident was a lapse in paying attention. An ID was requested and was given to the server. At the time, the bar was very busy and there was a shift change, and a mistake made," said one of the representatives. They acknowledged that there was no excuse for what happened. The bar has been in the current location for three years and had a doorman scheduled to be working that night who cancelled at the last minute. The doorman checks identifications and stamps patrons who are of age.

Selectmen took a harsh view of the liquor violation. "What bothers me more is that it's a tragedy in the making," said Selectman Allan Howard, obliquely referring to past incidents involving underage drinking. This incident was a second offense, resulting in a written warning to be sent to the company.

Immediately following was another hearing for serving alcohol to a minor, this one against Courtyard Management Corporation dba Courtyard by Marriott, 300 River Ridge Road, "It was a failure on our part to not get the ID," said James Wefers, general manager of the hotel. The server never asked for an ID and the incident, according to Wefers, has resulted in a reorganization of their poli-

cies and procedures. "We had to take a hard look at our organization internally. We did a total restructuring of the whole hotel. We hired a manager to directly oversee the bistro." The new manager will focus on alcohol compliance and the food service.

Wefers showed pictures of signage that is now displayed indicating that anyone can be asked for an ID. Selectman Thomas Maloney asked, "You are mostly seeing guests coming to your hotel?" Wefers stated that the bar is made up of primarily business travelers staying at the hotel with few patrons coming from the outside. Wefers emphasized that everyone must be asked for an ID. He stated that the server involved was now going through the company's progressive discipline process. Howard again repeated his concern, "We don't want a tragedy," but added, "Sounds like you've stepped it up." This was a second incident, with the first one occurring in November, 2018, also requiring a written reprimand be sent to the company by the board.

The selectmen's concern over liquor violations also emerged during the public hearing held during the meeting to grant Peter Morrissey, of The Boston Tavern located at 1210 Boston Providence Turnpike, a retail alcoholic beverage license for his restaurant.

Morrissey, the restaurant owner said, "My intent is to convert the old Outback Steakhouse to the Boston Tavern, a 190 seat restaurant, he said. Noting the previous discussion about serving alcohol to underage customers, Morrissey added that this will be his eighth restaurant with few or no violations. Howard reiterated the importance of training for staff to check IDs. Morrissey assured them his establishments are quite serious about it. Board Chairman Paul Bishop suggested better signage as it is difficult to see the restaurant from the road. In approving the liquor license, Selectmen chose to

also approve Morrissey's CV license subject to approval of the board of health.

Other business included General Manager Tony Mazzucco's recommendation to adopt a Complete Street Policy. "This is a grant program funded by the Commonwealth," he said, which makes money available for street improvement and expansion. Maloney asked for clarification that it does not require the Town to commit to anything in advance that may not be acceptable to the board. Mazzucco said that the Town is free to submit any plan for funding. "It will give us access to quite a bit of planning," he said. The request was approved.

Show cause hearings will be set in the future for two establishments, Olivio's Grille & Pizzeria, 1210 Boston Providence Turnpike, and Hibachi Steak House, Inc., 315 Morse Street, both of which have closed for business and are therefore failing to provide the public with the services contemplated by the licenses.

Howard recommended that he be designated as a representative to look at increases to benefits for disabled veterans, as Norwood appears to offer less funding than other towns. A motion for Howard to work with Mazzucco and others to look into this was approved.



MassDOT lot moving along

The Norwood Airport Commission (NAC) met on Monday for a special short meeting to vote on a request for payment from the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) regarding the new parking lot adjacent to the new Welch Administration Building.

The NAC voted unanimously to approve the payments, totaling more than \$165,000 for work completed in June and July.

According to NAC Chair Mark Ryan, the Town of Norwood is only on the hook for about \$8,261 of that tab and MassDOT will be paying contractor Lorusso Corporation the rest.

The 14,000 square-foot parking lot is part of the Welch Administration Building renovation, work for which started in April. The funding for both the lot and the building itself is picked up mostly by MassDOT as part of a grant, which covers \$1.79 million of the \$1.9 million project. The Welch building will have about 6,000 square feet in a two-story shell overlooking the two runways and was originally built in 2007.

"The work is moving along and the goal was to be substantially complete by June 30," said Ryan. "We expect work to be 100 percent complete in August and a move in date sometime in September."

The majority of the project was focused on fitting out the interior of the building on the

north side with a 2,000-square foot mezzanine level that will house Norwood Airport Management and Commission Offices, a records library and a conference room. New mechanical and HVAC Systems were also slated to be installed, and the remaining 4,000 square feet of the building will still be used for equipment storage; the building's original purpose.

Airport Manager Russ Maguire said in the past that the idea was always to have offices in the building, as it was part of the Phase Two plan of the original project in 2007, but the funds didn't materialize until late 2018. He said that MassDOT had been financing the construction of municipal airport administration buildings for years and Norwood had to "wait its turn."

Kennedy said she is looking forward to the day herself.

"I think it brings awareness to a lot of people who have not heard of the Circle of Hope," she said. "There are still some people in Norwood who may be unaware, and it helps the Town to see what the Circle of Hope is about."

Trails looking to upgrade graphics, talks Forbes

The Norwood Trails Advisory Commission met on Tuesday, July 23 and gave updates on its work to improve nature walking trails in the Town.

Chair Joseph Greeley said they are working with Town Conservation Agent Al Goetz on permitting for work in the northwest area of the Endean Trail to try to improve the drainage and the issue of flooding.

Also at Endean, Norwood resident and Boy Scout

Troop 49 Eagle Scout Candidate Noah Kerns is close to completing his project installing signage and way posts for the Cross Country trails there.

"On July 27 and 28, he'll be at the Endean and he's looking for scouts or other volunteers to help," Greeley said. "He'll be meeting with folks at the tennis courts at the Coakley Middle School at 8:30 a.m. both Saturday and Sunday."

The installation is expected to last until 11 a.m. on both days, and will involve

six locations throughout the trail system.

The group also discussed its most recent jaunt through the Forbes Hill property. According to member Vic Babbel, they made some interesting discoveries.

"Well there's a lot of mosquitoes out there for sure, but it was interesting," he said. "We found, covered in a tarp, two large plastic barrels and inside were all wires. Right next to the barrels were wire cutters and a spotlight, and so

Morrill Library Saturday and Sunday," he said. "Based on personal observation, the Senior Center was lightly used and the library was more heavily used...Both reported a fairly "brisk" business both days - people seemed to appreciate that they were open."

Cooper said Norwood seemed to have a higher temperature than surrounding communities, at least according to the National Weather Service, but Cooper said that could be a bit misleading.

"If you believe the weather stations, Norwood was one of the hotter of the hottest communities, although I think that tends to be a bit distorted," he said. "The reporting weather stations tend to be located at facilities like the Airport. At the Norwood Airport, between the asphalt runways and the wide open exposure, it tends to be a little more extreme than most of the rest of the Town."

Cooper did say there was one surprising result.

"The two outdoor pools were actually a little quieter than usual," he said.

Cooper added that electric usage hit a peak for the month on Saturday.

"Which is a little unusual because peak usage usually occurs on a weekday when businesses are in full operation," he said. "But it may not be the 'seasonal' peak, since the month isn't over and we still have the full month of August to go. Only a couple of short-term electrical problems reported."

Department of Public Works Director Mark Ryan said for water usage, there wasn't too much of a spike.

"We had cooling stations on Friday providing bottled water and some coolers," he said. "Over the weekend, it was a typical July water usage. We averaged 3.57 million gallons a day for those two days, which is not unusual for July. In the last three years we averaged 3.5 million gallons a day for all of July."

According to Norwood Fire Spokesperson Joe O'Malley, the department didn't see residents taking unnecessary risks, and they had no serious uptick in calls, heat-related or otherwise.

"Luckily the town of Norwood is great when it comes to weather emergencies, both heat and cold related," he said. "People tend to take the advisories very seriously and I

feel the cooling stations also helped keep everyone hydrated. We had the usual run of the mill calls; few motor vehicle accidents, fire alarms and medical calls, but for the most part we only had a hand full of heat related emergencies."

Cooper added that there were also no heat-related police calls, and he said he believes the Town, residents, staff and officials, acted in a professional and adequate manner.

"I do think most departments were impacted and they all reacted very well," he said. "The library and the Senior Center aren't open on weekends and our employees came in on a hot summer weekend, when many of them would probably be away."

I think there was some clandestine act in there, but they never got back to it."

As for the possibility of a trail, the Forbes Hill property was selected to be sold to Dr. Roberto Feliz for \$13 million to build a "medical city," but wetland buffer restrictions plus several other restrictions for public use make the area ideal for trails in the future.

"When you get up there you can see the remnants of an old road and one of the signs which used to be used by Polaroid. They used to have an exercise trail and you can see the remnants of trails there," Babel said. "It was very interesting, it was hilly and fairly close to the road."

Babel said in the eastern-most section of the property there is a 40-foot overlook looking down at the brook on the property.

"It's beautiful, he said. "If this medical thing comes through it would be great."

Greeley also reviewed the upcoming Craft Brew 5K from the Percival Brewing Company. The 5k race will start at the brewery's location at 83 Morse Street and go through the Endean Trail system. The race is set for August 17 at 5 p.m., and Greeley said this is the kind of thing the Commission should be looking at for uses of trails.


"If we could build a reliable map with reliable mile markers on it, then the sky's the limit," he said. "Any number of opportunities could come up on how to use it... But let's literally walk before we run and get a simple map online, as long as we can build on and add to it and get a little more fancy."

Greeley said he will be there to volunteer and, hopefully, collect donations for the trail from runners.

Also, Commission member Craig Austin gave an update on how he's been mapping trails in the Town. He showed the Commission his progress (a rough draft map of the Endean Trail System can be found on Page 6).

"We've been trying to produce some good, crisp maps," he said. "So I've been work-

ing on what is called QGIS, which is, among other things, software which uses a series of layers placed on top of one another."

The idea is to identify trials for residents to use throughout the Town since

many are unaware that a Town almost fully built out like Norwood is has nature trails to offer. Martin said it is a rough draft because some of the elements in the map are a bit ad hoc.

"The problem is just that

the maps were a little on the fuzzy side because we've been taking screenshots," he said, adding that clip art is also an issue. "You can spend a lot of time looking for the perfect icon and I spent way more than I wanted to."

Ask The Doctor

Junior Damato began servicing vehicles in 1969. He owns a 10-bay auto repair service center in Hyde Park and an 8-bay center in Middleboro. Junior is an ASE-certified Master Technician, ASE-certified L-1 and ASE-certified Natural Gas.

To the Doctor: I own a 2015 Buick LaCrosse with a 3.6-liter, V/6 engine. At 15,000 miles and 22 months after purchase, the battery failed. It was replaced under warranty. Then, after another 22 months, the battery died again. The charging system was checked and found to be working to specs. The battery was replaced again at no cost. Why are the batteries failing so often? I drive mostly short trips of five to seven miles – could this be part of the problem?

From the Doctor: Battery life varies a lot for many reasons. First, poor quality components and poor workmanship. Second, high under-hood temperatures if the battery is located under the hood. Outside temperature and driving conditions will also contribute. Short trips will cause the battery charge to lessen and shorten battery life. If you could connect a battery tender to the battery and keep it charged, battery life would extend. Make sure the battery that is installed has the most CCA available for the size of the battery.

To the Doctor: I have window tints on all my car windows, except the front windshield. The side windows have ripples on them. Can I use a hair dryer to heat them and squeeze the ripples out? It's hard to see through them.

From the Doctor: Old window tints did have ripples and some turned color after a few years. The use of a heat gun will not work. Peel off the old film, then have a professional retint the glass. I will tell you that the new film is thinner and less resistant to scratches. It is also much easier to remove from the window if needed. The glue on old window tints tends to stay on the glass and removal is usually done with a razor blade, soap and water.
