## NPD reshuffles to account for retirements

The Norwood Police Department held a promotion ceremony to further address the three retirements in the Department taking place through the end of February.

On January 22, Town General Manager John Carroll - based on recommendations by Chief of Police William Brooks - promoted Peter Curran from Sergeant to Detective Sergeant and Timothy McDonagh from patrolman to sergeant.

"We are excited for each and wish them all the best as they assume increased responsibilities," the department said in a statement.

Curran has been a member of the Norwood Police Department for 31 years and served as sergeant since 2007. Previously, Curran spent 17 years in the Bureau of Criminal Investigation, with the first seven years spent largely in patrol, as a member of the Impact Unit.

Chief Brooks said Curran was an "experienced" detective and would step right into his new position, left vacant by the January 23 retirement of Detective Sergeant Robert Rinn.

"He is a highly regarded investigator with an outstanding reputation," Chief Brooks said. "I am highly confident that he will continue the good work in our Bureau of Criminal Investigation."

## Task force preparing acquisition report for Selectmen

The 1.5 percent Task Force is preparing a report for the Selectmen on "phase one" of its activities relating to identifying properties for the Town to acquire, due sometime in mid-February.

According to Task Force Chairman David Hajjar, the report is needed so that the Board of Selectmen can prepare to ask for money at Town Meeting, in order to attempt to acquire property swiftly, and within the deadline of Norwood's temporary safe harbor from 40B develop-

ments, which ends in September.

The Task Force is charged with identifying potentially available properties in the Town of Norwood that could be acquired in order to cross the threshold of 1.5 of the Town's land devoted to affordable housing.

By reaching this threshold, the Town would be able to deny requests to build developments proposed under the state 40B and 40R laws, through which developers are able to bypass local zoning bylaws.

During a meeting on January 22, the Task Force reviewed

its document for prioritizing potential properties.

The document included thirteen properties - the total value of which came to \$32,713,400 - which will be evaluated according to uniqueness, liens, ownership type, timeline for closing, if they are adjacent to open space, and recreational opportunities.

In total, the Task Force is seeking to add 200 acres of land to the equation by which the 1.5 percent is calculated. These acres can be excluded from the total acreage count as Subsi-

tigation.”

McDonagh has been with the Norwood Police Department since 2004, and has served as a member of the Warrant unit since 2012. McDonagh is one of the unit's initial members. McDonagh has worked the midnight shift and the 4-12 p.m. shift, which was his most recent assignment.

“As our first line supervisors, sergeants have a challenging position,” Chief Brooks said. “But Sergeant McDonagh is up to the task and I have great confidence in him.”

Rinn - who had served 32 of his 37 years as a Police officer in Norwood - led the detective unit for 14 years prior to his retirement this month. He transferred from his hometown of Dedham to Norwood in 1982, where he started on the midnight to eight a.m. shift. He was then

promoted to sergeant in 1987, and had experience supervising every shift in the department, before being promoted to Detective Sergeant in 2001.

“Leading from the front, he formed a most talented, energetic and competent squad of detectives,” a statement from the Department read. “We wish Bob and his family many years of health and happiness in retirement.”

Chief Brooks also spoke highly of his retiring Detective Sergeant.

“Det. Sgt. Rinn will be sorely missed,” Chief Brooks said. “His personnel file is full of accommodations and accolades from local police departments and federal agencies.”

In addition to Rinn, the department also saw the recent retirement of Officer Milton Vega this month, and expects to lose Lieutenant Brian Murphy - the

Department's second-in-command, to retirement in February.

This has resulted in a reshuffling of the department, between promotions and the recent hiring of three officers to backfill, who are all processing through Transit Police Academy and the department's new officer protocols. Norwood sends all of its new hires to this academy, and Chief Brooks is an instructor there.

Norwood, at the urging of Chief Brooks, removed the Police Department from civil service policy during the Special Town Meeting in November.

“These are the last police officers who will be hired to the state's civil service system, and we will be giving our own entrance exam this spring,” Brooks said. “People interested in police careers should watch our website for the announcement.”

# Callahan boiler replacement moves forward

The boiler replacement project at the Callahan Elementary School is poised to begin this summer as paperwork and design processes are well underway.

According to Norwood Public Schools Building and Grounds Director Paul Riccardi, the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) granted approval for the project through its accelerated repair program in 2014. The School Committee and the Board of Selectmen both signed off on the project as well.

Town Meeting had looked into the project during the previous school year and the Selectmen had begun discussing the MSBA program in January 2014.

Riccardi said then that the Callahan school's boilers were 27 years old and were due to

be replaced.

During a Permanent Building Construction Committee (PBCC) meeting on January 15, Riccardi said that after receiving preliminary acceptance from the MSBA, they pursued funding from the Town and received an allocation of \$50,000 from town funds to bring on an engineer and a project manager.

Through the accelerated repair program requirements, Riccardi said officials "technically drew the names out of a hat of prequalified project managers and engineers."

These positions did not need to go out to bid because of the pre-qualification process, though the general contractor who will do the replacement must be put out to bid, which will be handled through Contracts Administrator Cathy Carney.

dized Housing Inventory (SHI) eligible land.

The 13 properties included on the document account for 236 acres, many of which were already identified in the Town's five-year open space plan for 2012-2017.

Much of the discussion focused on the "uniqueness" category. If a property is determined to be unique, the Town may be able to approach the landowners directly about acquiring it without having to put out a Request for Proposal, as municipalities are required to do in the state's Chapter 30B laws.

Task Force member and Conservation Commission chairman Cheryl Rogers believed that if a property abuts any conservation land, it could possibly qualify as unique. Assistant Town Engineer Andy Murphy said that the open space adjacency category could mean that the property was unique, but that there would likely be more than that required to prove the property's uniqueness.

Several of the properties on the list abutted conservation land and had also been plucked from the Town's Open Space list of properties to keep an eye on. In fact, only two properties - an almost 7-acre property and an

11-acre property - did not score on the "adjacent to open space" category.

Task Force member John Hall - who developed the document - noted that the 11-acre property also had among the highest costs per acre, and should be at the bottom of the priority list.

Community member Denis Drummy and Task Force member Brian Hardiman suggested that there was a significant amount of unused land at the end of properties occupied by large corporations that could be acquired.

Both suggested that Meditech and National Amusements had large tracts of land that were likely wetlands that could possibly account for the Task Force's 200-acre goal. Hardiman believed Meditech had around 117 acres that could be subdivided.

Murphy said National Amusements had already been looked at and doubted that much land could be extracted from Meditech, but he would look into it.

Halkiotis said that the issue was more complicated than simply approaching corporations about cutting off parcels of land, since the Town could not take a zoning-conforming property and

make it non-conforming with already approved plans.

Hajjar also provided an update on the Town of Stoneham's hearings with the Affordable Housing Committee regarding its perceived 1.5 percent status.

He said they had all the necessary documents, but none of it was "neat and clean." He said the presenters - the assessor and building inspector - did not look like they wanted to be testifying and left long pauses after questions from the hearing officer.

According to Hajjar, the hearing officer was interested in the results of Norwood's legal action with the state and the hearing was continued for 30 days. A decision is expected two weeks later.

As such, Hajjar said that the Task Force should look into putting together a book that would clearly outline the Town's position for Town Counsel to use in defense of the Town's figure.

He said that Murphy was working with Applied Geographics - with which the Town has worked before - to get a quote to have Geographic Information System (GIS) work done to that end. Hajjar believed they could request funds from the Selectmen for the services.

Riccardi anticipated going out to bid for a contractor by the end of February so that work could begin the day school gets out. He said this is because approved projects in the program must adhere to a strict deadline.

"They want it to be done within 18 months of the day they give you the green light. Your project has to be completed," Riccardi said. If a project is completed on time, the MSBA may decide not to reimburse the town.

Riccardi said that the MSBA gave the "greenlight" to do feasibility and schematic design work on the project and were expecting another review now

that they were approaching 60 percent design and document completion.

Town Manager John Carroll had signed off on a project funding agreement and the project also received certification from Town Meeting in November, when it allocated \$500,000 for the project, some of which would be borrowed.

Riccardi said the MSBA "agreed to do a 50.58 percent reimbursement of all allowable expenses."

Riccardi said the original estimate for the project was \$360,000, and then grew in response to costs associated with

## Offense sputters as Mustangs fall to Needham, 2-1

The season-long struggles continue for Norwood following a 2-1 loss to the Needham Rockets on Friday night.

The Mustangs (2-7-3) have scored just 17 goals in 12 games this season, tied for 52nd out of 54 teams in Division 1 with Archbishop Williams. Only the Wakefield Warriors (15) have fewer goals.

“The effort is there,” said head coach Bill Clifford after the game. “We can’t buy a goal.”

After seemingly snapping out of the funk with eight goals in a two-game span vs. Milton and Dedham earlier this month, the Mustangs have regressed over their last four games, finding the back of the net just twice since Jan. 10.

It warrants mentioning that in this four game span (0-3-1), goaltender Denis Drummey has allowed only six goals, giving his team a chance to win every night. Norwood is tied for 33rd in Division 1 in goals against with 35, a respectable figure of

just under three per game.

“He’s played well,” said Clifford of Drummey. “(But) you can’t count on him for everything. He’s kept us in when we need to be, it’s not like we’re

getting blown out. The bottom line is we can’t score.”

Zach McKenna scored at 7:10 of the first period for Needham. McKenna was on the receiving end of a Connor

Forbes pass from behind the net to the bottom of the slot, where he’d gone uncovered by the Mustangs to make it a 1-0 game. Norwood responded a little more than five minutes

later, as Connor Flynn crashed the net on a pass from TJ Glover to tie the game at 12:24

## Perry's big night lifts Norwood to key victory



Although Norwood has captured just one win during a six-game homestand thus far, the team earned a victory over a talented Needham squad.

With just one game left on a six-game homestand, Norwood’s record currently stands at 1-4.

There’ve been a few heartbreakers (a two-point loss to Randolph on Jan. 18, 52-50, and a four-point loss to Framingham last Tuesday, 54-50); a frustrating loss (an 11-point loss to Walpole on Jan. 16) and a total blowout (a 30-point setback to Bishop Feehan on Sunday, 78-48).

But the Mustangs’ one win, a 45-42 decision over Needham on Friday night, just might overshadow all of the failures. Not only did Norwood knock off a Rockets team that had been 8-3, they were able to rally together after scoring a grand total of zero points in the first quarter.

“In some ways, all you can do is laugh at that,” said a fired-up head coach Rich Cormier after the game. “They only had eight [points]. And then we beat them in the second quarter 16-8 to go into halftime tied up.

Given our offensive struggles this season, it would have been pretty easy for us to shut down after that first quarter. I was really proud of the way they played.”

Trailing 33-31 after the third quarter, Kevin Perry put the Mustangs on his back and accounted for 10 of Norwood’s 14 points in the fourth. For the game, Perry finished with 20 points to lead the team, and upped his scoring average to 15 points per game (PPG).

The Mustangs were battling the injury bug throughout the week to some key players. Sophomore Natanael Foncesa-Castro attempted to play after spraining his ankle at practice earlier in the week, but by the second half was confined to the bench to ice up. Senior captain Chris Bell was injured in the second quarter before returning in the second half to help Norwood hold on for the win.

“The win is a great win. Needham’s a really good team; they’re very well coached,

they're very well disciplined. I thought defensively, on the boards, they really dug in. When you're struggling offensively, that's how you're going to win games. They did what they had to do tonight," said Cormier.

As the coach pointed out, the Mustangs never like to make it easy. They had several chances to make it a two-possession game inside of two minutes, with free throw shooting nearly becoming Norwood's undoing.

Leading 44-41, the Mustangs were also called for a shot clock violation inside of a minute left. Needham missed on its next possession, with Joe Mazzotta securing the rebound for Norwood. Bell was fouled with 11.7 seconds left and went to the free throw line, where he missed the front end of a 1-and-1.

Needham grabbed the re-

bound and again had a chance to tie the game before a Mazzotta foul sent the Rockets to the line with 6.1 seconds to go.

After making the first shot to make it a two-point game, Bell grabbed the rebound on the second and was subsequently fouled again. He nailed the first to put the Mustangs back up by three, but missed the second.

Norwood went into a prevent defense of sorts, having sent everyone but the shooter Bell into the backcourt on the free throw attempts. Despite that, Needham was able to get an open look at a 3 which would have tied the game after Bell's miss. The ball took a Mustang bounce off the front of the rim, however, and fell to the floor as time expired as Norwood held on for the win.

The Mustangs were scheduled to wind up the homestand

on Tuesday vs. Archbishop Williams, a game that was postponed due to the blizzard.

They'll next be in action on Friday night at Milton High School at 6:30 p.m. Norwood

fared well its last time out vs. the Wildcats, defeating them 62-42 on Dec. 22.

of the first. The Mustangs outshot the Rockets 8-5 in the opening period.

But a defensive lapse later in the second enabled Needham to retake the lead on a Jack Piersiak goal at 13:13. Piersiak shot up the
