## Conservation forced to deal with those 'dam' beavers

The Norwood Conservation Commission (ConCom) met on July 21 with Norwood Conservation Agent and Environmental Planner Holly Jones to discuss the removal of two beaver dams around the land at the Norwood Airport.

"There has been quite a bit of discussion about the dams, both through the airport and the golf course just upstream from the airport, who are finding themselves flooded," Jones said.

Jones said usually, if a beaver dam is a threat to public safety or public health, the Board of Health and the Health Department can jointly issue an emergency certification for any work that involves the animals themselves.

She said the certification allows for trapping the animals. Then the ConCom can issue an emergency permit for anything related to the dam itself.

"I spoke with the assistant director of the airport today, because the director is on vacation, and they haven't been able to complete the trapping yet because the water is so high, it's actually above the level of the dams right now, just because of the amount of rainfall we've been having this month," she said. "But once that trapping is complete they do intend to come to the ConCom for an emergency permit."

Jones said the threat to health and public safety includes keeping nuisance animals and water fowl away from the

## Rosen knows there is no replacing Bernie Cooper

### Norwood hires new assistant manager

Tolland, Conn. Town Manager Michael Rosen said he's looking forward to coming back to Massachusetts after serving in Connecticut for about two years.

Rosen has been selected to replace former Assistant Town Manager Bernie Cooper in the next month or so, and he said while he knows he cannot fill Cooper's shoes, he intends to further Cooper's vision to make the Town a better place than when he found it.

"I'm never going to be able to live up to the standards that Bernie Cooper established for this position," he said. "I'm not trying to fill his shoes, but maybe pick up where he left off. It's an honor to take over for somebody who's such a staple in the community. I'm going to try my best to live up to the standard he created for this community."

Rosen said he actually knew Cooper a little bit through encounters at conferences while he was working in Bedford, Mass.

"I was actually a member of the Massachusetts Managers Association and I had run into Bernie many times throughout the four years I was in Bedford," he said. "During conferences, training seminars, webinars, things like that. I remember one conference we actually sat down and had dinner together, almost like a mentor and mentee relationship. I know him ever so slightly – I wish I had the opportunity to get to know him better – but even with the handful of encounters I had with him, it was clear that he was a career public servant."

When it comes to local Massachusetts policy, Rosen said he remembers quite well the Chapter 40B laws that have given Norwood so much trouble in recent years in terms of its affordable housing stock or land dedicated to affordable housing. Rosen was working for the Town of Bedford when it was actually named a Housing Hero by the Massachusetts Housing Partnership in 2017, and he said he's looking forward to bringing that expertise to the Town. This new perspective might especially be needed since some affordable housing in Norwood has its expiration date looming and the state is likely to soon require areas around train stations to have multi-family affordable housing in some capacity, as of right.

"The last time I was in Town, (Norwood General Manager) Tony Mazzucco gave me a driving tour of the community and he pointed out a couple of developments that had 40B

## Planner updates Board on projects

The Norwood Planning Board met on July 26, 2021 and voted unanimously to approve a two-year extension on an open lot car storage lot on Carnegie Row.

The two parcels in question are located between the Goldfish Swimming School and the Marathon Sports Center on Carnegie Row in the Vanderbilt Business Park. Specifically, they are parcels 15-11-43 and 15-11-22 on the Town's GIS

runway and to make sure the runway does not flood.

“I did do an inspection there about two weeks ago and got to see the beaver dams before they went underwater,” she said.

ConCom member Peter Bamber said he understood that a beaver dam near the airport would be a health and safety risk, but apparently the other dam is located near the golf course.

“If it was just one dam on the golf course, I would not personally deem it a health and safety risk,” Jones said. “The golf course was in fact the initial group that reached out to me. When I thought it was just the golf course, I gave the advice that if it’s not an imminent threat they would have to apply to Mass Wildlife for their trapping permit and go through the notice of intent process with the commission for anything involving a beaver dam. Although the golf course is very concerned with the dam – it’s always flooding – and the dams are not on their property and so they can’t ask us for a certification or a notice of intent. Truly, although they are concerned, the airport are the actors the commission would be dealing with.”

ConCom member and Airport Commission member Michael Sheehan said the last time there were dams on the airport property was about two or three years ago.

“I understand a similar process happened in 2017. The golf course said the dams have

been there since April, but I can’t verify that,” Jones said. “They build them very quickly, and that’s why I think the airport wants to trap them first before breaching the dam.”

Jones said she believes the flooding the airport and golf course have been experiencing is more due to the heavy rainfall lately rather than the dams.

“But the Airport basically wants to do preventative maintenance to mitigate the risk of flooding in the future,” Jones said. “I actually was looking at the Town’s hazard mitigation plan earlier today and the airport is listed as one of the problem areas for flooding and the main thing they talked about was ditch maintenance.”

Jones said the Airport is focusing on ditch maintenance to keep the waters at bay.

“I know they don’t normally have to close because of flooding; the last time they did was in 2010,” she said. “We will be getting a notice of intent at some point in the coming months to some changes to the runway alignment.”

Jones said it is not legal to relocate beavers because of the risk of spreading disease to wildlife populations, and so the beavers are euthanized.

“There is also a beaver season for people to hunt from November to March, and so the special permit is to allow the hunting of beaver outside the beaver season,” she said. “And then it will almost certainly be the Mosquito Control District that does the actual breaching of the dams.”

Jones said the ConCom’s chair, in this case Stephen Washburn, can direct her to make the necessary permits available. Washburn expressed hesitation, but ultimately agreed to get the process rolling.

“I signed the Moderna one, I’ll sign this,” he said. “It seems like a real challenge that’s presented itself but I have unfortunately an ominous sense that the removal of the beavers is not the only component required for a solution to this, but we’ll see.”

In other news, Massachusetts Department of Environmental Resources (DER) representative Chris Hirsch updated the Commission on the status of the removal of the Trap Hole Brook dam (a man-made one). He said the timeline is now at 100 percent

design, and they are just finishing up the permitting process.

“We are on track within the next week or two to be through permitting completely, and ready to get on to the next phase of bidding, construction and post-construction,” he said. “At this point, we have two grant applications running for funding the project and we’re hoping to hear from them in August. I have good news in that DER has been allotted some extra money from the governor specifically for dam removal and so I’m very optimistic that we’ll be able to get a funding package together for this project.”

Hirsch said much of the

work will be to improve the stream to allow for habitat generation of fish, other fauna and local flora. He said the timeline is currently set to start construction this winter if funding comes through on time.

“We’re wrapping up construction during the beginning of the growing season so there’s not a lot of time where you have exposed soils that are prone to erosion if a large storm were to come through,” he said. “Our preference would be to start mid-to-late winter and be wrapping up in early spring to get the plantings to sort of veg up to help with erosion control of the site.”

## National Night Out coming to Norwood for first time

The Norwood Police Department (NPD) will be hosting its first-ever incarnation of a National Night Out celebration for the Town on Aug. 3 at 7 p.m.

Chief William Brooks said the event came from a desire to have an informal but regular celebration with the community, as the department does do several meet-and-greets through the year, but never one specifically for the police department.

“In the past, we’ve generally had a boost on Norwood Day and that’s when people who want to talk to us come by. We do an open house in October during Fire Prevention Week with the Fire Department too. And so there are opportunities we have to meet the community, and that’s why I think we passed on it before. But really I just look forward to any event where we can talk to the public more, whether it’s adults or kids or combination. Last night they were filming ‘The Mothership’ on the Common and people came up to see me and say hello or catch a glimpse of Halle Berry and you know anything that gives us a chance to talk to the public I look forward to it.”

Brooks added that he was not able to land a part in the film while on set.

“I actually noticed they had a cruiser there and somebody playing the part of an officer and I think I could have done a better job, but that’s okay,” he said with a laugh.

Brooks added that Norfolk County Sheriff Patrick

McDermott actually called him up to see if they were doing any National Night Out events.

“It was actually partially prompted by a call from the Sheriff, who said he could provide some assistance if we were interested in doing it,” he said. “It just sparked some internal conversations and we thought, ‘why not do this?’ I think, number one, coming out of Covid and number two, coming out of last year’s protests around the country, I think anything we can do to be in the public and available for conversations I think is helpful to us and the public.”

Brooks said the night will have activities for the kids like touch-a-truck areas, candy, the department’s children’s book and other events. He added there will also be some live music, as the event will be sharing the Common with the Junior Women’s Club Concert Series kick off event that night.

“We did talk to the JWC, and they don’t think there will be a conflict,” he said, adding that they will be set up on the Nahatan Street side of the Common, whereas the concert will be on the East Cottage Street side. “There will be some music in the background, but we’ll be on the other corners of the Common and we think we can share the space, we’ve got enough room. We were actually willing to move it to another night but it wasn’t necessary. And the advantage is that people coming for the concert will ask what’s going on with the police and people coming for us will have background music. So we’re looking forward to it.”

Brooks added that they will

also be cooking up grill food during the evening as well.

“We’ll be cooking hot dogs and hamburgers and maybe

## Eva is no diva



aspects to them," he said. "Even though I've been in Connecticut for the past two years, I'm still pretty well-versed in 40B law and I remember Bedford had 18.3 percent affordable housing, which is a huge subsidized housing index. I know that Norwood is above the threshold at the moment, as told to me by the General Manager, but it's always something that you have to keep track of in terms of trends. I mean, if you have a large development come in that has no affordable component, you could find yourself dropping below the threshold again."

Rosen added that affordable housing in Norwood is also a benefit for residents in and of itself, setting aside the threat of 40B developments.

"Socially, it's a good thing to have units that are affordable to professionals and people who want to downsize later in their lives," he said. "You want to have that housing stock available to them. The manager is going to be focusing on what tasks he would like me to work on, but since I have a background in housing, I would assume that would be one of them."

Rosen said he was also impressed by Norwood's apparent steady and consistent leadership.

"One of the reasons I specifically looked at Norwood - it wasn't like I was putting my resume all over town - is the track record of long-standing management," he said. "That includes the members of the Board of Selectmen, the Finance Commission and Town Meeting members. So to somebody like me who's coming from the outside, when you see a Town that's got steady leadership that doesn't turn over too frequently, that's attractive."

One of Cooper's focuses was on the Town Hall Carillon, which is currently being rehabilitated through Community Preservation Act funds. Rosen said he's excited to see the musical contraption, as he, like many both inside and outside the Town, had not been aware of the instrument before.

"I've been to Norwood twice now during this transition period and at some point I'm hoping to get a tour, because General Manager Mazzucco had told me about it," he said. "I had to Google the phrase because I was not aware of it before."

Rosen said Mazzucco also took him up to Highland Cemetery to see Cooper's gravesite. He said he felt it was appropriate that Cooper's site included a bench to aid a weary traveler, as

many officials have relayed to him that Cooper was always one to be as helpful as possible.

"I thought it was important to Tony to show the successor where Bernie's resting place is," he said.

Rosen said he grew up in Queens, and he felt while Norwood isn't as dense, it does share some characteristics that he said attracted him to the Town in the first place, which works out, since he's now in the process of buying a house here.

"Norwood has a lot of good things going for it," he said. "It's located near Boston; I know it's got three commuter rail stations in Town which is appealing for a city person like myself. I grew up in Queens, New York and I do like having a city nearby. Plus you're in proximity to other great towns, even places like Rhode Island and New Hampshire aren't too far away. So most of my family still lives in New York, and I'll be proud to show off Norwood when they come to visit."

And while Rosen is from Queens, Mazzucco was quick to point out that he was not a fan of The-Team-Which-Must-Not-Be-Named.

"He assures me that he's a Mets fan," he said with a laugh.

never have become a patient of Dr. Eva Balash. It seems that decades ago when I was put on two new medications for prostate-related issues, an unsightly rash broke out on my face. Map website (axisgis.com/norwoodma/).

The parcels are owned by David Spiegel, who owns several properties throughout the Town. His attorney, Jess Deratzian, said he has been trying to attract a commercial tenant to the area with no luck.

The feeling of the Board was that though this use had been temporarily granted for about 10 years, the Board did not feel that Spiegel had been intentionally keeping it that way to the point of blocking potential tenants. The site currently is allowed to hold 218 cars, but Planning Board member Debbie Holmwood pointed out she went there recently and saw only about 15 cars in the lot.

“My client has been trying for years to get somebody interested in that property, to develop it and to be, obviously, more lucrative,” Deratzian said. “The goal of the property is not to store vehicles. It’s not very lucrative for him either. But this is unfortunately the best case

right now. I don’t know if you’ve seen it, but it’s a very industrial area and there are not a lot of entities that want to build up in that area.”

Deratzian said Spiegel is not opposed to building on those properties, but he needs a tenant to go in there before he feels he can commit to construction.

“But it’s so industrial, he hasn’t been able to find that,” she said. “It’s just given the area and the nature of the property, he just hasn’t been able to do that. He owns many other lucrative properties, but this just happens to be in a place that’s not so, let’s say, sought after.”

Town Planner Paul Halkiotis said given the current land use market and the sharp decrease in demand for office space since the pandemic, he would be surprised if there was any change in a year, and so asked the Board to consider a two-year extension. Holmwood expressed reticence to voting for such a long continuation of what was

supposed to be, 10 years ago, a temporary use.

“(Former Planning Board member) Al Porro’s going to come out of the woods here and whack me over the head for this,” she said with a laugh.

The Board approved an extension to Dec. 7, 2023.

In other news, Halkiotis updated the Board on several projects he believes will be coming for approvals in the next year.

He said he met with the new owners of the former Mercer property off of Route 1A, Alexandria Real Estate. He said all of the old Polaroid property, with the exception of the apartment building there, is owned by the company.

“They cater specifically to biotech and biopharm companies,” he said. “They now own all the properties that Moderna

operates from, and they currently are working to rehabilitate the old Mercer building for Moderna to take over. It’s our understanding they’re working on plans we’ll see in about a year or so as they continue to develop the other side of the Polaroid campus where Mercer is now. There are some large parking lot areas there and a lot of developable land. I think in the future we’ll see some more development in that area.”

Halkiotis added that the time frame of this planning process could coincide with the hospital rebuild process.

Halkiotis also said that the Planning Department will be switching to a digital permit processing model in the coming weeks.

“We continue to ready ourselves to transfer over to an

online permitting process that’s going to be starting on the beginning of September,” he said. “Folks are going to need to go through an online process if they want to pull a building permit or submit an ANR (approval not required) plan or a subdivision plan. They’re going to need to do that electronically. We, on our end, have been working to get up to speed on using that software, but I’m sure it’s going to be interesting when we have to go live with it.”

One may be inclined to remember that an old Chinese curse is, “May you live in interesting times,” which, roughly translated, sounds like a blessing. But it would be doubtful that anyone pulling building permits would want the experience to be interesting, surprising or lively.



# Funeral reimbursement funds for COVID-19 deaths available

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought overwhelming grief to many families. At FEMA, our mission is to help people before, during and after disasters. We are dedicated to helping ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the virus.

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA is providing financial assistance for COVID-19 related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.

How to Apply: COVID-19 Funeral Assistance Helpline, 844-684-6333 | TTY: 800-462-7585. Hours of Operation are Monday – Friday, 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Eastern Time.

Call this dedicated toll-free phone number to get a COVID-19 Funeral Assistance application completed with help from FEMA's representatives. Multilingual services will be available.

Get answers to frequently asked questions about the application process on our Funeral Assistance FAQ page.

If you use a relay service, such as your videophone, Innocaption or CapTel, please provide your specific number assigned to that service. It is important that FEMA is able to contact you, and you should be aware phone calls from FEMA may come from an unidentified number.

**Funeral Assistance Policy:** On June 29, 2021, we amended the funeral assistance policy to assist with COVID-19 related deaths that occurred in the early months of the pandemic. This policy change will allow applicants to submit a signed statement from the certifying official on the death certificate or the local medical examiner, or coroner, that attributes the death to COVID-19 deaths that occurred between Jan. 20 and May 16, 2020.

**Who is Eligible?** To be eligible for funeral assistance, you must meet these conditions: For deaths that occurred after May 16, 2020, the death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to COVID-19. For deaths that occurred from Jan. 20 to May 16, 2020, any death certificate that does not attribute the cause of death to COVID-19 must be accompanied by a signed statement listing COVID-19 as a cause or contributing cause of death. The signed statement must be provided by the original certifier of the death certificate or the local medical examiner or coroner from the jurisdiction in which the death occurred. The statement must provide an additional explanation, or causal pathway, linking the cause of death listed on the death certificate to COVID-19.

If you had COVID-19 funeral expenses, we encourage you to keep and gather documentation, including: Official death certificate that shows the death occurred in the United States, including District of Columbia and the U.S. Territories. If the death certificate was issued from Jan. 20 to May 16, 2020 it must either attribute the death directly or indirectly to COVID-19 or be accompanied by a signed statement from the original certifier of the death certificate or the local medical examiner or coroner from the jurisdiction in which the death occurred listing COVID-19 as a cause or contributing cause of death. This signed statement must provide an additional explanation, or causal pathway, linking the cause of death listed on the death certificate to COVID-19.

If the death certificate was issued May 17, 2020 or later, the death certificate must attribute the death directly or indirectly to COVID-19.

If you are eligible for funeral assistance you will receive a check by mail or funds by direct deposit, depending on which option you chose when you applied for assistance.

Dear Doctor: I want to change the antifreeze in both my Honda Accord and Toyota Camry both 2016. I looked at the antifreeze and the Honda is blue and the Toyota is pink. Can I use the universal multi purpose ion both? –Rick

A) In the old days a universal would be OK, however with late model vehicles such as yours, I would use the specific antifreeze for each car. Most brands offer factory replacement color and quality. I have every brand made for each brand vehicle. Mixing of antifreeze could cause jelling in the cooling system. The color is not the only difference in the antifreeze. The chemicals and additives are also unique for each different brand.

Dear Doctor: I own a 2017 Toyota Prius with just over 100,000 miles and the local shop suggest I change the transmission fluid. They said it is a simple drain and fill. What are your thoughts? –William

A) I am all for changing transmission fluid on automatic transmissions at 50,000 plus miles especially if the vehicle has a troublesome CVT transmission. This is another are I use the factory brand transmission fluid. For owners of vehicles with the CVT transmission fluid changes are a must at 50,000 miles or sooner.


