

## Fred Holland Day's 150th birthday celebrated here

On Saturday, several Fred Holland Day enthusiasts were on hand to celebrate the 150th birthday of the influential local photographer.


Born on July 8 in 1864, the photographer was raised in Norwood before coming to prominence as a world-renowned artist. His work is on display at the Museum of Fine Arts (MFA), where the celebration began.

"It was the 150th anniversary of his birth so people who have written a lot about him or people associated with him thought it would be nice to get together and do something to celebrate that," said local author and historian Patricia Fanning. "So we organized a program that started at the MFA in the early afternoon. They saw the exhibit, 'Truth and Beauty,' that has some of Day's photographs in it."

Fanning is well versed in both the history of Norwood and Day. In 2008, she published a book about the artist titled, "Through an Uncommon Lens: The Life and Photography of F. Holland Day."

The birthday celebration for Day didn't end at the MFA, however.

"People then came out to the Chapel [of Saint Gabriel at Highland Cemetery] and there was a cello concert by Cashman Kerr Prince. People got to see the chapel and we had descriptions of the detail work and the history of the chapel, which was given to the town by the Day family in 1903," said Fanning. "Some people then went up to Walpole to the Maple Grove Cemetery which is where Day took some of his Sacred Studies and then we all went to the Day

House and had a potluck supper."

The Day House, where the Norwood Historical Society is based, is the family house of the famous photographer. He lived there until his death in 1933. Celebration goers came far and wide to toast the life of the groundbreaking photographer.

"People came from Maine, New York, Washington, and the Cape and all over the place. It was fun. They believe he was very important to photography, each of them had written about him or were involved in research about the time, pictorialists or Day," said Fanning. "He was born and raised in Norwood. He was self-taught, but always an artist at heart. He first began in book publishing, but then discovered that photography was more his media. He was one of the leaders in the pictorialist movement in photography

along with Alfred Stieglitz. They were the top American pictorialists. Pictorialism was this group that wanted to prove that photography should be considered a fine art.”

His effort as a fine art photography advocate and curator was important for the recognition of the art form and its artists.

“Along with having these great photographs of himself, he put together a show called ‘The New School of American Photography’ which he took to London and Paris in 1900 and 1901 for exhibit. It really established American

photographers in Europe as being important in the field and cemented their place in the history of photography,” said Fanning. “His sacred studies were photographs he took of Christ’s life and death, his thought being that if photography is a fine art, then subjects that are open to other art forms should be open to photography and the life and death of Christ was certainly important in art.”

“DifferRentals is a great company, they give us the dunk tank, the cotton candy and the moonwalk. They donate a few items, which is fantastic, so we’re not paying full cost for everything. We just through the years have explored different vendors,” said Sarah Griffin, Norwood Play Camp Director. “WROR reached out to us actually ... this is the first year we’ve had them and they’ve been fantastic. We’ve always done the ice cream eating contest and that’s from the Sugar Cone right down the street.”

In addition to the dunk tank, face painting, and ice cream eating contest, there was also a moonbounce, swimming, pony rides, limbo, and an outdoor videogame truck.

The ice cream eating contest was one of the day's most popular events. Children lined up

around a table and dunked their faces into bowls of vanilla or chocolate ice cream with whipped cream and chocolate sauce. The winners of each round often ended up wearing some of their ice cream as well.

“My secret is I just slam my face in the ice cream,” said camper Paul Oginski after winning a round of the competition. “I won because I want to eat ice cream.”

The event cost \$5 for the public, with all proceeds benefiting the Norwood COH.

“We used to donate the money to the Jimmy Fund, but then we decided to keep it more local, so we’ve been donating to the Circle of Hope for the last four or five years,” said Griffin. “We try to get everybody involved in different activities ... it’s not huge, but the kids have a blast. It’s the little things in life that make them excited. They’re having a good time.”

Griffin pointed to the cotton candy machine as an example of one of the most popular activities. It maintained a very long line throughout the carnival.

James Gamel and Marco Pettilo, both 11 years old, said they

loved the radar gun pitch-speed challenge, which was run by the Norwood Police Department and the face painting the best.

“We got beards!” said Gamel.

The Norwood COH Foundation was established in 1998 in memory of Michelle Kennedy, a young Norwood resident who suffered from leukemia. During Kennedy’s battle with the disease, many in town pitched in to help her. According to the COH, “funds raised are used to assist residents of Norwood who find themselves in need due to a catastrophic medical event.” Since it was founded, COH has provided just under \$500,000 in assistance to Norwood residents.

“The town rallied around [Kennedy] when she was sick. Everyone came out and did a tremendous job. She unfortunately didn’t survive her illness, but she asked her mom to make sure no matter what, that down the road if there was anybody else that needed help, that they receive similar support. So that’s how the whole idea of the COH came together,” said Tim McDonough, COH President.

# Norwood Day plans under way

With just over a month to go before the celebration of one of Norwood's best new traditions, Norwood Day plans are shaping up.

"It's a great day for the town to come out and support its civic, fraternal organizations. There are many nonprofits in town that are represented, many Norwood businesses that are represented," said Linda Berger, Recreation Department Program Director and member of the Norwood Day Committee. "Anywhere from 10 to 15,000 people is the estimated attendance every year."

The 12th annual Norwood Day will be happening on Saturday, September 13, from 9:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The day kicks off with the annual parade from the Morrill Memorial Library, and proceed down Washington Street towards the Walter J. Dempsey Memorial Bandstand on the Town Common. Vendor tables and food tents

will be set up on the Common, where the annual Volunteer of the Year award ceremony is also held. There are also a variety of other activities.

"We have pony rides, trolley rides, a rock climbing wall, a games van, kid's entertainment, kid's rides — there's like five amusement rides and bouncy houses. We have a food tent that represents several of the Norwood restaurants that come in and give away samples," said Berger. "So it's a great day planned out for children and adults of all ages. Anyone can come from 9:30 in the morning until 3:00 in the afternoon, they can visit booths, they can participate in games. It's a great family event."

On Friday, Sept. 12, there will be fireworks at the Coakley Middle School around dusk, with Radio Disney coming to provide even more entertainment.

"On Friday night, we have fireworks sponsored by Furlong's Candies and the Gallery Automotive Group, and we have Radio Disney to

provide some games and prizes sponsored by Dedham Savings Group ... this year, on Friday, we're also going to have a train ride," said Berger. "We have a petting zoo [on Saturday] we added last year. There are always new additions. [Gerald] Miller, [Superintendent of the Recreation Department] is always trying to keep things fresh and exciting for the families."

The day wouldn't be possible without the many volunteer hours and generous sponsorships by local businesses.

"We work with local businesses like Gillooly, Santander Bank, and Dedham Savings Bank to get sponsorships for the different activities so we can keep the cost down to the people who participate in the actual Norwood Day itself," said Berger.

## A UNIQUE PERSPECTIVE OF MANAGER

I have had a front row seat every day since 1979 from which to gain the unusual perspective on our General Manager/CEO. While we have had our share of professional disagreements in 35 years, I believe that my seat has provided me with some unique insight into "just who this Mr. Carroll is." During his exemplary tenure here, Mr. Carroll has been an extremely intelligent professional, whose educational resume includes an engineering degree from one of the finest universities in Boston. DPW) to now being responsible for Norwood's highly regarded hundreds of police, fire, public works, and electric light/water/sewer utility forces.

## SETTING NORWOOD'S PRIORITIES STRAIGHT

To the Editor:

You are right to point out in your last editorial that new housing developments in Norwood will compete with existing rental units for tenants. One of the precepts of the "Smart Growth" ideology is that single family homes and smaller multifamily buildings are socially and environmentally detrimental. I refer to "Smart Growth" as Dense Growth because it seeks to remove residents from their single and multifamily houses and place them in densely packed apartment buildings. Dense Growthers often see their projects as only suitable for other people while they themselves live in single family homes.

Dense Growth benefits construction companies, absentee landlords, and lawyers who turn a quick profit while homeowners are left footing the bill indefinitely. The Town Hall's ongoing push to build high density apartment blocks Uptown is the latest example of Dense Growth. A small cadre of landlords and their lawyers would boot commercial renters out of their storefronts and replace them with apartment units that they can quickly cash out. Town Hall recently spent over \$3,000 on a meeting with local business owners to pitch this idea even though this meeting could have been held in a public building for free. Where is the business community in all of this? The first place to look is the Neponset Valley Chamber of Commerce. Its president supported the Plimpton Press proposal with a letter to this paper, letters to Town Meeting members, and a speech at Town

Meeting, despite the fact that Plimpton would contain retail space which would compete with local businesses. An agenda item at the last Selectmen's meeting clarifies the situation. The Chamber of Commerce billed the Town \$7,500. The agenda doesn't say why. Whatever the stated reason may be, the Chamber has been lobbying on behalf of Town Hall in the meantime.

Norwood's first priority should be jobs and its second priority should be housing. After all, there is no point in having housing available if people don't have jobs to pay the bills. Our leaders should pursue having more companies come to Town so that people can get back to work. A resident wrote to you two weeks ago that she was less than pleased with the handiwork of our local government. There is room for improvement and much of that improvement has already begun. The defeat of the Plimpton Press proposal sent a strong message to our leadership that we want common sense policies rather than haphazard plans formulated by outside interests. Similarly, any plan to further degrade the Uptown tax base will be vigorously opposed. Of course, in order to get Norwood back on track we need to do more than prevent mistakes. I will write soon with possible solutions to the problems that Norwood faces.

## VRAA IS A WORKABLE SOLUTION

To the Editor:

This August, our nation honors the 49th anniversary of the Voting Rights Act (VRA) of 1965, the historic civil rights legislation crafted to protect against discrimination in voting. Again this year, a gray cloud hangs over this momentous occasion. Just over a year ago, key components of the VRA were gutted by the U.S. Supreme Court's decision, leaving room for discrimination to gain a better foothold at the ballot box. While many were hopeful when a bipartisan group of lawmakers introduced the Voting Rights Amendment Act (VRAA) at the beginning of the year, months later we are still waiting for Congress to finish what it started. The VRAA is a workable, commonsense solution that would modernize the elections process and protect voting rights against discrimination. Without a strong VRA, our ability to fight off anti-voter legislation and keep our elections free, fair and accessible is significantly weakened. there are still some slots available, but Berger says those interested should hurry to reserve them.

“We’re still accepting applications for entertainment, Paula Pelaggi coordinates the entertainment every year ... Chairman of the Board of Selectmen Mike Lyons coordinates the offerings of the food tent, he’s our community volunteer chair for that. For booths, applications went out to Norwood businesses in April and non-Norwood businesses in mid-June. We still have some openings, probably about 20 booths at this time, but we get applications every day,” said Berger.

Norwood Day Buttons to get into the event will be on sale in August. The buttons cost \$3 in advance, but will also be available on the day of the event for \$5. Berger believes it’s one of the best days in Norwood and advises everyone to keep the date free on their calendar.

“When you look down the street anytime that it’s going on, you can see the street is packed. It goes all the way down Washington Street from the top where Conrad’s is in Guild Square, all the way down to the corner of Nahatan and Washington. And it’s just amazing that everyone gets together,” said Berger.

## Historical home finds loving new owners

Driving down Pleasant Street, it's impossible to miss the beautiful and ornate house marked number 46, especially since its renovation.

“Originally we drove by and were like ‘look at that,’” said Jacinta Murphy, who owns the house with Jim Murray. Their family is just starting to settle into the home after a long renovation process.

The house became available

last year, and they decided to scoop it up.

“Economically, it makes sense to [tear older homes down],” said Murray. “What we put in this house is more a labor of love ... I think, all and all, we look at more than just the economic side of it. It’s a great place to live, and a great-looking house.”

Murphy agreed, but said that the process isn’t for everyone.

“It’s a passion and loving. You really have to want to do it, if you don’t, forget about it,” said Murphy.

According to town records, the house was built circa 1870, but may have incorporated elements from a former structure dating back to the mid 19th century. The house is also a wonder for it’s unique architecture.

“Architecturally, 46 Pleasant Street ranks among Norwood’s most ornate Second Empire or Mansard houses. Only the F.O. Winslow House at 219 Walpole Street surpasses this house in terms of complexity of form and

## Stingrays edge out Dedham, 228-224

It was a busy week for the Norwood Stingrays swim team, as it saw action in two meets against tough opponents and a mile swim, but not even a packed schedule could slow down Norwood's swimmers, who continued their excellent form.

To start the week, Norwood overpowered a short-staffed Westwood 300-147 at Hawes pool on July 22. The Stingrays had 124 swimmers compete in the meet, while Westwood is a traditionally much smaller program in the summer, compared with its winter roster.

"Westwood swam against us very well in the butterfly and breaststroke for the 9-12 year old boys and girls, but Norwood's depth paid off in the end," said Norwood coach Kim Miller.

The Stingrays were in action again on Thursday, this time traveling to Dedham for an indoor meet, where they came out with a very close win over their opponents, 228-224.

The meet was ultimately decided by a 15-18 year-old girls relay

race. Both relay squads were well-matched and the race itself was decided by two yards, giving Norwood the race and meet win.

Norwood sent 87 swimmers to the meet, which was still more depth than Dedham could account for.

"Dedham is a very small but strong team. They typically have a good showing at A-Regionals, but not so many B-Regional swimmers," Miller said.

According to Miller, Dedham was the only yard meet of the season, meaning that many swimmers were looking to finish within the cut-off times needed to qualify

for A-Regionals in their respective, which this year will take place in Newton on August 9. B-Regionals will be held on August 2.

In addition to swimmers who qualified with winter season times, many Norwood swimmers have now qualified for A-regionals following the Dedham meet, including: Charlotte McDonald, Bridget Roach, Brendan Hurley, Sherry Deng, Michael Scuderi, Gia Rodriguez, Charlotte Rivard, David Deng, Sarah McCarey, Giacomo Serratore, Mikhaila Hurley, Jacob Bodenhofer, Grace Gillis, Manny Escobar and Kileigh Gorman.

On July 25, Norwood sent nine swimmers to compete in the Mile Swim at Dug Pond in Natick. Of those nine, only eight competed due to injury. As a team, Norwood finished ninth out of 12 teams. The field consisted of 112 total swimmers — 57 girls and 55 boys — from Natick, Needham, Newton, Framingham, Canton, Millis, Medfield, Walpole, Norwood, Dedham, Westwood and Sherborn.

For the boys, Norwood sent David Deng — who in his third year was the most experienced of Norwood's boys — Manny Escobar, Brendan Hurley and Ben Kerns. This was Kerns' second year competing, while Escobar and Hurley are both first-year entrants.

For the girls, Norwood sent an experienced group of Charlotte Rivard, Caitlin Sullivan, Julia Kiley, and Sherry Deng. Rivard and Sullivan have four years experience, while Kiley has five. Deng is a second-

year swimmer. Annabelle Garrity, who warmed up but did not swim, represented the lone Norwood girls rookie.

Rivard finished 12th overall among girls times.

"Teams are allowed to enter five girls and five boys — when they don't have a full field, they must pick finish tiles, which are large numbers — this puts these teams at a disadvantage ... We pulled two tiles, one boys and one girls," Miller said. "Points are awarded based on finish. Teams with the lowest scores place higher."



richness of ornamentation," reads the Norwood Historical Commission's record of the house.

For Murray, it was important to maintain as much of the original structure as possible. His Somerville-based construction company specializes in working on historical homes.

"I do a lot of brownstone renovations in the South End and in Boston," said Murray. "With this house it wasn't a full gut, we did more of a restoration. We took down what was needed, there was a lot of rot and damage as you can imagine."

The main staircase is adorned with handrails and spindles which Murray saved from a demolition job in the South End. The posts are made from mahogany which Murray estimates to be at least 120 years old. Murray also used several of the original doors in the house, which he said each took several days to sand and refinish.

The house is nearing completion and just needs some finishing touches, including the garden. Murray and Murphy are both excited to turn this historical house into their home.

"I love old things because they have a lot of character. They can be a lot of work, but have a lot of character," said Murphy.

Another element of the house that is hard to miss is the lion and unicorn statues on top of the house.

"Everyone asks about [the animals]. Mainly it was a joke," said Murphy. "We bought the house and we were living in the apartment in the back during the renovations last September. We were talking about the garden and the plan is to make it beautiful ... and Jim came across these statues online ... A month goes by and he pulls up in the dead of night and he has these two animals in the back."

Murphy said they were afraid the animals were going to be taken by kids, and crowded the statues into their apartment. Once the weather was nicer, Murphy said the safest place they could think to keep the animals was on the roof.

"They're just fun, people love them," said Murphy.
