

## Officials fire back over test scores criticism

Assistant Superintendent Alec Wyeth led a discussion at last week's School Committee meeting of student achievements and strategic administrative goals, which was in part a response to some criticism of the schools at the Annual Town Meeting over perceived poor test scores.

Wyeth pointed to a host of awards the Norwood schools have received, including Coakley Middle School students winning three first-place prizes and three honorable mentions in the school's second year of competition in National History Day. One group researching the Erie Canal took second place in the state and competed at the national level in Washington, D.C.

At the high school, the Mustang Literary Magazine won second place in the All New England Awards at the New England Scholastic Press Association Conference at Boston University, and the Norwood High TV students also received eight awards for journalism, said Wyeth. The TV students received an additional first-place prize at the recent National Student Television Network Convention in Los Angeles for producing a documentary in the "Spot Feature" category, he said.

Those were just some of the awards that were mentioned. Wyeth also recognized several Norwood teachers that have received awards.

"You get a sense of the range of talent that's going on here in the Norwood schools," said Wyeth. "We've got some great faculty coming into the system, and we want to hold on to them and develop their talents. With the strategic plan we have in place, I think we've put a lot of good professional development in place to improve our scores. We have tried to build programs we can be proud of. We are paying attention to the SAT scores and to bringing them up. But it goes well beyond an SAT number. It goes well beyond even the MCAS. I urge the public to keep the perspective where it needs to be."

Beyond standardized testing, Wyeth said the strategic goals strive to give students the 21st century skills they will need to advance in higher education and ultimately in the workplace. Those skills include both leadership and working in a team, he said.

School Committee member Paul Samargedlis took a more direct tone in addressing the comments made at Town Meeting, calling them "talking points" that were used in debating both the school

## Norwood woman strives to help Haitian children

For many, the earthquake that devastated Port-au-Prince, Haiti in January of 2010 was a call to action to offer humanitarian support to a nation whose inhabitants have long suffered from neglected infrastructure and poor living conditions.

For Rita Russo, however, the destructive quake and its

deadly aftermath merely brought to the world's attention a struggle that she and others like her have been battling for years to try to improve the lives of the Haitian people.

Russo, a Norwood resident, was first introduced to the St. Boniface Haiti Foundation back in 1979 through her church, St. Denis Parish in Westwood. Teaching a group of students at the church, she was looking for a service project to

focus on when she was introduced to one of the founders of the St. Boniface Foundation, Nanette Canniff. Russo was instantly drawn in to the plight of the Haitian people.

"Before I knew it, I was volunteering [for the foundation] once a week," she said. "You get involved with Haiti, and the next thing you know you go to Haiti. Then you get

budget and the hockey rink project.

"There were some talking points about test scores and rankings. If you don't address them, these talking points become facts," he said.

Samargedlis also took issue with arguments that Norwood has "bloated administrative salaries," saying that it is not the case, and the town has reasonable salaries in line with what school administrators in other towns make.

"I'm just sick of the drums being beat that we're mismanaging our bottom line. We have managed within our bottom line. We're adding important pieces. We've added to build capacity," he said.

"There is comparative data that I think we need to do a better job of presenting," said Badger. "That level of detail, I think, sometimes gets left out. We cover it here at our meetings. We do have an excellent school district. But I think some of those questions we could answer more

succinctly."

**Field dedication**

The meeting started with Norwood High Principal George Usevich and Brian McDonough requesting that the front Field Hockey field outside the school be named for Cathy Shachoy.

Shachoy, who worked at Norwood High for over 40 years, retired at the end of the school year. She most recently served as dean of students.

Shachoy coached several sports at the high school over the years, including leading the Norwood High field hockey team to a championship in 1984.

"Cathy Shachoy is a part of history in Norwood High School field hockey," said Usevich, noting that Shachoy also received an honorary diploma at the high school graduation last month. "She dedicated 41 years to the school on the hill, the school she

loved."

School Committee member Jim Gormley noted that Shachoy has been a "leading figure" in the growth of high school girls' sports, not just in Norwood but throughout the state, as well.

"She's a wonderful woman and it's well deserving," said Chairwoman Courtney Rau.

The board voted unanimously to dedicate the front field to Shachoy.

**Cleveland principal resigns**

Also at the meeting, Hayden announced that Cleveland Elementary School Principal Scott Williams has submitted his resignation.

Hayden said a search will begin immediately for a new principal, as he wants to have someone on board as soon as possible to prepare for the new school year in September.

Williams was hired in the spring of 2009 to replace the retiring Robert Fitzpatrick. He came from Hanson, where he was assistant principal of the Maquan Elementary School.

## Vets helping Vets

More than 100 Norfolk County Veterans, some in uniform and some in civilian clothes, attended District Attorney Michael Morrissey's first Veterans Summit. They served in the Middle East, Korea, southeast and central Asia, and this month they came together in Norwood to learn about ways they can serve again.

"We invited all of Norfolk County's Veterans Services Officers to our Canton office this spring and asked their help identifying the greatest needs and issues they saw for the people they are charged with serving," District Attorney Morrissey explained after the event. "Their answer was access to services for Veterans, Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and readjustment challenges, substance abuse and unfamiliarity with the Norfolk County Veterans Court. That became the template for the Summit."

Morrissey said he con-


siders it imperative for government at every level to be looking for ways to support those who have served in uniform. He said his work with the Veterans Officers is ongoing, looking for programs and avenues to support those who have served.

The Summit featured Operation Iraqi Freedom Veteran Kevin Lambert, who now works for the state's Department of Veterans Services presenting the "Battlemind," a program about transitioning from combat and service to home and civilian life. It is useful both for the Veteran facing challenges personally and those who work to help fellow Vets navigate adjusting.

Judge Mary Hogan Sullivan, her son a US Marine, presides over the Norfolk County Veterans Court that she formed with the support and partnership of the District Attorney. The Judge moderated a panel explaining that first-in-New England program designed to connect court-involved

Veterans with the services they need to right their paths. State Rep. John Rogers, of Norwood, spoke briefly about the legislative measures he is trying to implement to support the Veterans Court and its mission. Established Veterans also learned how they can become involved by serving as formal mentors for men and women who are involved in the Veterans Court program.

"Military service carries the obvious sacrifice of leaving the safety of home to place yourself in harm's way," District Attorney Morrissey said following the June 12 event. "It can also exact a less obvious price, as the training and experience that shapes young men and women into effective warriors become obstacles to re-entering civilian life. What we can do to help take down those obstacles, we are determined to do."

# TD Bank looks to open new Norwood site

The Mobil gas station on Nahatan Street in Norwood is being eyed for the site of a new bank in the downtown area.

John Stewart of Norwood-based Arista Development LLC said his company is involved with redeveloping the property located at 143 Nahatan St., which is currently owned under a real estate trust in Dartmouth, from a gas station to a TD Bank.

"It's a good location for a bank. We feel it's a good location, and obviously so did TD Bank," said Stewart. "We're developing it for them."

The proposal, which involves demolishing the exist-

ing station and constructing a roughly 2,300-square-foot bank with a drive thru, requires approval from the Planning Board but does not call for any zoning relief, said Stewart.

Arista Development, located on Route 1 in Norwood, is handling the permitting along with attorney Phil Macchi II, whose office is also in Norwood.

The Planning Board has scheduled a public hearing for Monday, July 15, at 8 p.m. at Norwood Town Hall to hear about the plan. The applicant is requesting both a special permit and major site plan approval.


Stewart said the proposal includes reconfigured and new parking, signage and

landscaping to enhance the site.

"There will be a change in the layout, and we are adding parking," he said, although he was unsure of when the construction might start if the Planning Board approves it.

Also on July 15, the Planning Board will open a public hearing at 7:15 p.m. on the Department of Public Works (DPW) project, which involves complete removal and replacement of the existing buildings on Lyman Place.

## WE WON'T BACKDOWN

"What are you doing for the Fourth?"

That bit of small talk is pretty common this time of year. In asking it, and being asked, there are common answers: a trip to Cape Cod, getting a boat out on the water, a barbecue, etc. Of course, there is that biggest of celebrations, Boston's annual concert and fireworks display at the Esplanade.

Some wouldn't miss it for the world. Others, when you ask if they plan to attend this year, tell us they won't be on the banks of the Charles. Too crowded, some say. The weather is too iffy, others tell us. Traffic and parking are a nightmare, others demure.

But one reason for not going doesn't seem to emerge, at least not in the conversations we have had and heard: fear.

It was only a couple of months ago that the city, and nation, was shocked when bombs detonated at the finish line of the Boston Marathon. Since that time security has been a predictable concern. We can certainly expect more police, explosive-sniffing dogs, undercover eyes and bag searches as thousands head to the Boston Pops concert. We've faced such security measures for years at the concert, and this year is only different in that those efforts will be expanded and even more visible.

But none of that is scaring us away. We may get annoyed at the temporary intrusions, which is just human nature. But we aren't hearing people say that these reminders of terrorism are frightening them away. We have yet to hear anyone tell us that they will avoid Downtown Boston because they fear for their safety.

Of course, the threat of terrorism is very real, especially this year in a politically unstable world prone to copycat offenses. But we are not be worried. Some might consider it foolhardy; it is really a show of resiliency.

The Fourth of July in Boston is a cherished tradition. No one can steal it from us. None will tarnish, twist or undermine it. We have shown our mettle, and we will not back down. We will celebrate the day as we always have. We will celebrate America, our city, and ourselves.

When we think of our forefathers, we think of them as freedom fighters. The British of that day, of course, probably viewed them as terrorists. But that comparison fails when considered against the backdrop of history. Boston's colonists fought for independence, for their right to govern themselves and live life as they saw fit. Where they sought to build a nation, today's terrorists seek to destroy it. But no matter how nefarious their deeds, no matter how close to home they hit, Boston has not, and will not, give in to the fear. We are bloodied, but unbowed.

The fireworks that crackle overhead and the patriotic marches that fill our ears, all stand as testimony that Boston, like the nation its people helped birth, will always prevail.

# Schools unveils new website to improve communication

The School Committee was surfing the web at last Wednesday night's meeting.

But it was not emails or Facebook updates they were checking up on: They were perusing the new Norwood public school website.

At the meeting, School Technology Director Joe Kidd gave a

brief presentation on the new website, which was built through Campus Suite, a product of Kentucky-based InnerSync.

The site, which is still [www.norwood.k12.ma.us](http://www.norwood.k12.ma.us), officially launched last Thursday morning.

Kidd said the schools solicited bids for a content manager to develop the new website, and InnerSync came back with the best among nearly a dozen pro-

posals. "It's a huge amount of work. Literally hundreds of pages of content needed to be reviewed and uploaded onto the new site," said Kidd, who began as the district's technology director back in October.

He said the development of a new, easier-to-use website exem-

hooked. They are just such warm, loving people. They have so much to be unhappy about, but they're not."

Russo said she ultimately became the foundation's first employee, working in an administrative role and serving as its communications director. It began in 1983 with a Walk for Hunger at the poorest parish in a working-class section of Quincy. The parishioners of St. Boniface decided to donate half the money they raised in the walk to the poor of Quincy and the other half to Mother Theresa's newly-opened Home for Children in Port-au-Prince. They were told their money would be accepted under one condition: that they hand-deliver it to Haiti themselves.

Russo officially retired three years ago, although she still makes at least an annual trip to Haiti with a team of eye doctors and has a goal of establishing a permanent eye clinic there.

St. Boniface's main goal is providing medical care for the people of Haiti, many of whom suffer and die from highly treatable diseases due to poor sanitation and drinking water, said Russo.

"Haiti is an ocean of need," said Russo. "It's not a thing of

the past."

The organization has worked to transport Haitian children to the United States to receive Boston-area medical treatment free of charge through its partnership with the Ray Tye Medical Aid Foundation of Braintree. During the course of their stay, the children live with host families and typically stay in the country for around five months or so, depending on the type of procedure, said Russo.

Russo and her husband hosted Junior Jean Louis, a boy with a severe facial tumor, during his first trip to the United States in 2002. During his time, he attended kindergarten classes at the Oldham Elementary School.

"They were so nice at the Oldham," said Russo.

Louis has been back to live with the Russos on three more occasions since, as he has continued to undergo surgeries to fully correct his facial deformity.

"It's very hard sending him back," said Russo, noting that Louis has become like another son to them and has many friends in Norwood. "He calls me now when he needs something."


Thanks to the treatments, Louis, who turns 17 years old next month, has more confidence than ever before and is

living a much happier life, said Russo. She taught him to read during his last visit in 2010, she noted with some pride.

The most recent Haitian child to receive medical care is Johvenka Laveau, a 15-year-old girl with a "severe" case of pulmonary stenosis, a congenital heart defect involving obstruction of blood flow from the heart to the lungs, said Russo. Incredibly, Laveau was due to receive treatment in the United States much earlier, but the foundation lost touch with her for two years after Haiti's 2010 earthquake, before eventually finding her alive in a hospital, Russo said. She was staying with a host family in Hanover over the past two months during her treatment and returned to Haiti a few weeks ago.

"These are all extreme cases. We call them traumatic cases," said Russo, noting that the St. Boniface Foundation has grown from the small grassroots organization from when she joined to now having over a dozen staff in Randolph and over 100 employees working down in Haiti.

plifies the overall goal among the schools to built greater communication and presence in the community.

“The superintendent had a goal to improve communication with the public via our website, and that’s what we tried to do,” said Kidd. “It’s a little bit cleaner than the other website. Parents don’t have to look far to find where that important information is.”

Prior to developing the new site, Kidd and his technology department staff surveyed parents and teachers on what they wanted to see improved over the old site. He said one thing was that parents wanted to be able to access homework assignment online on teachers’ personal pages.

Kidd said some teachers wanted to transfer all of their information over to their new personal sites, while others simply wanted to start fresh.

Teachers will be trained to use the new website, said Kidd, and there will be weekly tutorials called “website Wednesdays” over the summer at the Savage Educational Center. There is also a four-minute video tutorial on how to navigate the site.

“It’s not a very difficult tool to learn to use,” said Kidd when asked about teachers maintaining their own sites with updates for students and parents. According to Kidd, each school will continue to maintain its own website as before, and one new feature called “virtual backpack” will involve posting all documents sent home with students on those sites in case they are lost or don’t make it home in hard copy.

Another major focus of the project was trying to create a user-friendly mobile format of the website, said Kidd.

“Around 20 to 25 percent of our web traffic is coming through cell phones, so we tried to create a format that was easy to scroll through and easier to consume,” said Kidd. “We want to serve our users the best way we can.” Kidd said the new site is only the first phase of improving the web presence of the Norwood schools. The next steps will be to continue training the staff and upgrading the content as needed.

“The website is only as good as its content. We’ll be working with all of the departments over the summer to upgrade the con-

tent,” he said.

Superintendent James Hayden praised Kidd and his staff for taking on the challenge of upgrading the website.

“He really made a science out of this,” said Hayden in referencing the research that went into the work. “It’s really about customer service. It’s a very, very difficult task to change over to a different site. I really think parents are going to be very pleased with this.”

School Committee member Badger said it would be an understatement to call the old site cumbersome.

“You can’t even quantify how much better this is,” he said.

Kidd encouraged those with thoughts and ideas about the new website to use the comment form under “Contact Us” at the top of the site.
