



## Historic aircraft in town for Norwood Day

The 25th annual Wings of Freedom tour of historic World War II aircraft will make its regular stop at Norwood Memorial Airport this year just in time for Norwood Day.

The tour, which includes a B-17 Flying Fortress, a B-24 Liberator, and a P-51 Mustang, should be arriving by 4 p.m. on Sept. 12 and will be open to the public that afternoon.

"The Wings of Freedom tour really honors our veterans, while giving the public unique and up-close access to these wonderful aircraft from a bygone era," Norwood Airport Manager Russ Maguire said in a press release. "So we're very excited to once again host the Collings Foundation in Norwood."

Also on display this year will be several contemporary aircraft currently based at the Norwood Airport, possibly including a jet, helicopter and other aircraft. Admitted guests are free to walk around these aircraft as well.

The display will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sept. 13, which also happens to be Norwood Day. Because this is the first time the tour has coincided with Norwood Day, the town has made it easier for Norwood Day participants to see the aircraft.

The town has arranged for trolleys in Norwood Center to shuttle Norwood Day participants to and from the display at the airport.

The Wings of Freedom tour is run by Stow, Mass.-based non-profit, the Collings Foundation. According to its website, the Collings Foundation aims to "organize and support 'living history'

events that enable Americans to learn more about their heritage through direct participation."

The Wings of Freedom display will also be open on Sept. 14 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and again on Sept. 15 from 9 a.m. to noon. There is free parking at the airport at 89 Access Road and guests will be admitted through Gate One.

Admission is \$12 for adults, \$6 for children 12 years old and under, and free for World War II veterans.

For those interested in a flight on board one of the aircraft, there are 30-minute flights available in the B-17 and B-24 bomber planes, and either 30-

minute or one hour flights in the P-51 fighter plane.

Flight experiences in the B-17 and B-24 aircraft are usually \$450 per person, according to the Collings Foundation website, which also states that a majority of the funds count as a tax-deductible donation to the organization.

The tour also offers flight training in the P-51, dubbed "Betty Jane," for a higher cost. Participants will have the opportunity to see what it is like to fly a historic World War II fighter plane. ## Complaint against airport commission chairman dropped Hues questions Selectmen's next move

Ahead of their Sept. 10 meeting, members of the Airport Commission took steps to resolve a personal dispute this month at the Dedham District Court.

On Sept. 3, a Clerk-Magistrate chose not to issue a criminal complaint against Airport Commission Chairman Thomas Wynne for allegedly throwing a stack of papers at commissioner Oulton Hues during a June 23 meeting with Wynne

and fellow commissioner Mark Ryan following the June Airport Commission meeting.

According to Hues, the issue was resolved before the hearing began, during a brief interaction between Wynne, Hues and their attorneys.

"Wynne's attorney initiated this meeting before the Court hearing and acknowledged his inappropriate actions at the meeting on June 23," Hues said.

In an interview after the hearing, Hues said the criminal proceedings

ceased with his acceptance of the apology.

"Mr. Wynne apologized and I accepted his apology. From that point, I dropped the criminal complaint," Hues said. "He said that he'd like to start with a clean slate and go forward from here."

At press time, Mr. Wynne had not returned this newspaper's phone calls requesting comment.

According to Hues, the June 23 meeting was held to discuss several emails he had sent which expressed

some concerns and to cover the events of the June Airport Commission meeting he had missed.

After the complaint was issued, Ryan publicly commented that he and Wynne had called the meeting to discuss proper conduct of an Airport Commissioner.

According to a police report filed shortly after the meeting, Wynne did acknowledge he had thrown a few papers, but said they had hit Hues' desk before

landing on the floor. Ryan, however, said that the papers weren't thrown.

Paul Shaughnessy also attended the June 23 meeting at the request of Hues, but not in any official capacity as a member of the Airport Commission. He submitted a witness statement to the Board of Selectmen supporting Hues' telling of the incident.

The closed hearing on Sept. 3 was attended by Wynne, Hues, Shaughnessy, town counsel Brandon Moss, Airport Manager Russ Maguire and others.

The alleged "clean slate" mentioned after the hearing is a much different result than some had anticipated.

Before the hearing, sources close to the Commission correctly assumed that the Magis-

trate would not issue the complaint, but also believed that Hues and Shaughnessy would be "removed from the Commission for troublemaking and lying based on a no bill at the court."

Hues himself has wondered if the Board of Selectmen, which appoints members of the Airport Commission, planned to take any action — whether against him or Wynne — based on a meeting he had with Board of Selectmen Chairman Michael Lyons about the complaint in the weeks before the hearing.

"There is nothing, no action, that was contingent on the issue that the Board will be doing," Lyons said.

For now, the hearing appears to resolve one of the more notable issues for the Airport Com-

mission, which has seen several notable disagreements of late.

Aside from the paper incident, the Commission is yet to resolve an issue regarding current tenant Boston Executive Helicopters (BEH), which requested additional space at the airport in order to become a fuel base operator.

A Part 13 complaint, which deals with economic discrimination, was subsequently filed with the Federal Aviation Administration. The Secretary of the Commonwealth's Public Records Division also sent a letter on May 27 expressing concern over the deletion of an audiotape from a meeting requested by BEH.

"It is my understanding that the recording was deleted prior to both the Commission's receipt of your request, and the Commission's approval of minutes for this meeting," the letter from Supervisor of Records Shawn A. Williams to BEH's attorney reads. "Although the Commission had not received a request for the recording at the time it was deleted, its failure to properly retain this record raises concerns regarding its records management practices."

# Selectmen provide update on Upland Woods

The Board of Selectmen touched on a number of issues facing the town, most notably the Upland Woods 40B developments, in between appointments during a meeting on September 9.

The 40B discussion was prompted by several letters submitted by resident Denis Drummey and the Department of Environmental Protection regarding the withdrawal of an appeal by Drummey to environmental law, which had stalled the proposed Upland Woods development by Braintree-based developer Campanelli.

Drummey sent the letter on August 25 because the complaint he filed prevented Campanelli from moving forward with the development. Norwood's one-year safe harbor status from 40B developments was also set to expire on September 5 if Upland Woods was stalled.

According to a copy of Drummey's letter obtained by this newspaper, Drummey's complaint centered on an "industrial-sized storm water

sewer (to) be situated in the middle of delineated vegetated wetlands," which he believed would create "significant storm water management and flooding issues" for nearby neighborhoods.

"If I do not withdraw soon, Campanelli cannot get their final permit from the (Zoning Board of Appeals and Building Inspector) and Norwood loses safe harbor and runs the risk of other 40B's coming to Town," the letter read.

Safe harbor status prevents developers from initiating 40B developments, under which developers are not accountable to certain local restrictions if the town does not have 10 percent of housing stock or 1.5 percent of developable land area dedicated as affordable housing.

"I do compliment Mr. Drummey for attempting to stop this apartment complex and at the same time compliment him to know when to say when and allow us to move forward with this, to not be inundated with more complexes," Selectman Allan Howard said.

When the complaint was withdrawn, a letter from the Massachusetts Housing Part-

nership was sent to Campanelli and the Board, notifying all parties of the project's final Chapter 40B approval.

"With the appeal being withdrawn, they were able to finally review the information before them and come to this approval which then allowed Campanelli to file for their building permits," Selectman Bill Plasko said. "But those building permits were only able to be obtained because Campanelli is a company large enough with deep enough pockets to fund the \$339,000, approximately, necessary for those building permits."

Had Campanelli not been able to fund that cost, Town Manager John Carroll said, the safe harbor status would have expired. As of now, officials believe the town is entitled to another year of safe harbor, though they are still waiting on final confirmation.

Despite this, Plasko said that a competing developer, the Davis Companies, had gone to the Zoning Board and Building Inspector meetings with plans prepared for the same area, and is ready to challenge the safe harbor status. In fact, they showed up on September 5 to file development plans.

The meeting began with Norwood Chief of Police William Brooks, who submitted a monthly report of the department's activities. Brooks

# OPINION

## REMEMBER

There is little fear that any of us are unaware of the attack on our home soil in 2001. The World Trade Center tragedy will be forever known by the date it occurred, 9/11. Of course, little memory-jogging is needed. Even on this, the 13th anniversary of the event, media coverage will be persistent and memorials plentiful.

Reminders of the fateful day are still with us, in ways big and small, touching and infuriating. The aftermath led, directly and indirectly, to two wars and the loss of thousands of soldiers - and we are still on the brink of war, with ISIL taking on the mantle of our top terrorist threat. We still, years later, must pass through a metal detector to enter town and city halls. Air travel, al-

though less inconvenient than it was in the immediate aftermath, is still frustrating and painful, thanks to the security measures. The NSA was gifted with the ability to intrude on the privacy of nearly all Americans. The militarization of police forces, in the name of homeland security, has sparked a crucial debate and helped inflame riots in places like Ferguson, Missouri.

The Boston Marathon bombing reopened many of those still-healing wounds, reminding us what terror feels like when it strikes in our backyard.

We all know, full well that the after-effects will linger for years to come. It may be decades before 9/11 is more a

chapter in history books than a constant, daily reminder.

But set aside all these ancillary intrusions on our peace of mind, as difficult as that may be. September 11 shouldn't be about dwelling on these persistent pain points; we have plenty of other days in the year for that. No, instead reserve time to reflect upon the human toll of the attack.

There was a period of time after the attack where it seemed that almost anyone you talked to had some allegedly direct connection to it. "I almost went to New York that day!" "My old college

# Library announces youth programming

Norwood to increase its recycling efforts because a lot of recyclable material is being thrown away, when it could be recycled and re-purposed," Rivard said. "By recycling, we could reduce the amount of waste in landfills and provide new material to use."

For two years now, Mosca has worked as the youngest member of the trash and recycling crew for the annual Rhythm and Roots Music Festival each Labor Day weekend in Charlestown, R.I.

According to a statement forwarded by the Recycling Department, "Recycling and reusing are important to (Mosca) because he knows that every single product takes energy to produce, gas to travel to market, then to people's

home, then once again when trash trucks haul it away."

According to town Recycling Coordinator Doris Burtman, the Mosca family does whatever it can to avoid throwing recyclable materials in the trash, including asking their neighbors if they have space in their recycling cart. Burtman said she encouraged the family to apply for a second recycling cart.

"Norwood is committed to increasing the collection of curbside recyclables. The town asks all residents to not toss recyclables in the trash. Obtaining a second recycling cart is easy and there is no charge," Burtman said.

The August drawing marks the first time that those selected have been Norwood students.

According to Rivard, there are plenty of simple steps people in Norwood could do to get into the habit of recycling.

"To be a better recycler, you have to think before you throw anything away because items that you think of as trash may be recyclable," Rivard said. "If you use plastic items, it is good to recycle them, but it is even better to look for other materials. For example, using the same cloth bag when you go to the store is better than accumulating plastic bags and then recycling them."

The Town of Norwood hereby gives notice that it has determined it to be in the Town's best interest to waive the advertisement requirements for the acquisition of unique property in the Town of Norwood for the purpose described below.

The Norwood Municipal Light Department ("NMLD") will be undergoing a project to replace its aging Transmission Infrastructure, which includes its 115kV transmission lines (high tension lines). This project includes work which will cause unavoidable permanent and temporary wetlands impact, thus requiring the Town to mitigate the damage to these wetlands.

The Army Corp of Engineers, along with the Town's consultant, VanasseHangenBustlin, Inc., has identified property on University Avenue in Norwood identified on the Town's Assessor's Map as Map 22/17/3 (4.49 acres), Map 22/17/4 (3.42 acres), Map 22/17/5 (6.14 acres), Map 22/17/102 (63.32 acres) and Map 22/18/2 (6.05 acres) as containing land which would best meet the requirements for mitigation of the impacted wetlands. The land, known as the Walker property, connects to conservation restricted areas and would help preserve the watershed. It is sandwiched between two already-preserved properties. The Walker property also makes up a portion of the Fowl Meadow Ponkapoag Bog Area of Critical Environmental Concern ("ACEC"). The location of the proposed property, when added to the two abutting properties which are already protected open space, will provide a contiguous connection of approximately 305 acres of land all recognized for their significant habitat value.

The proposed property is approximately 83.62 acres. The appraised value of the property is \$465,600 and was performed by the F.W. Bucklin Appraisal Company, dated May 26, 2014. The proposed purchase price of the acquisition is \$420,000.

mentioned the department's participation in a new substance advisory coalition called Impact Norwood, which was part of an initiative by the Norfolk County District Attorney's office.

Brooks also highlighted the recent spat of break-ins to unlocked cars, notably off of Route 1 and near Neponset Street, and urged residents to lock their cars.

Brooks then introduced the three newest members of the department, officers Diego Silva, Brendan Sweeney, and Stephen Easter. The officers graduated last month and have begun their three-month field training term with more experienced officers.

Each officer mentioned his strong ties to the town and Brooks highlighted Easter's knowledge of Spanish and Silva's ability to speak Portuguese.

"I think, if you don't know it yet, you are in the finest profession to be in," Selectman Paul Bishop said to the new officers. "I wish you the best and congratulations on your appointment."

Chief Brooks discussed misuse of a gaming machine in the Shamrock Pub on Railroad Avenue, stating that he understood prizes from the machine were possibly being paid out in alcohol from the bar.

Brooks said police have taken the machine, but would defer to the Board's decision as to how to proceed.

The Board voted 3-2 to file the information with no action

taken because there was not yet enough evidence to show a violation. Chairman Michael Lyons and Plasko were in dissent. Plasko said that the Pub does have a history of problems and the owners should appear before a show-cause hearing.

Michael Antonellis of Veteran's Taxi went before the Board to address complaints against the company brought to several Selectmen by Norwood residents.

Complaints included long wait times of 50 minutes or longer for a cab, different pricing for customers each time despite taking the same route, and rude and vulgar behavior by drivers and dispatchers.

Antonellis said his company had taken steps to address some of the issues and would continue to do so.

The Board also voted not to increase 2015 license fees for entertainment based on a survey of surrounding towns. The vote was 4-0 with Helen Donohue abstaining.
