## FAA fires warning shot at Norwood

On Nov. 2, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) sent out a revised determination (replacing the original one dated Oct. 30, 2018) – made by Director of Airport Compliance and Management Analysis Kevin C. Willis – regarding a formal complaint filed by Boston Executive Helicopters (BEH) against the Town of Norwood and the Norwood Airport Commission (NAC).

The director's analysis and decision found the Town and the NAC to be in violation of their federal obligations regarding Norwood Memorial Airport (NMA), and was the outcome of a formal Part 16 complaint that BEH filed with the FAA in March, 2015.

This was the latest development in an involved, drawn out, and legally contentious effort by BEH to be issued a

fixed-base operator (FBO) permit by the Airport Commission.

An FBO permit would enable BEH to expand its business from its charter helicopter operation (based at the Airport since 2010) by allowing it to provide a wider range of aeronautical services to the public – including aircraft fueling, maintenance, and storage.

Currently, Flight Level is the only FBO in business at NMA and – as noted in the Director's Determination – leases approximately 14 of the Airport's 688 acres.

BEH's formal FAA complaint was the result of its continued unsuccessful efforts to lease the extra apron (tarmac) space it deemed necessary to effectively function as an FBO.

Boston Executive currently leases a 30,000 square foot lot that it took pos-

## Schools receive grants, talk tech upgrades

The Norwood School Committee met for an hour-and-a-half on Monday, Nov. 5 at the Savage Educational Complex and discussed several issues facing the district.

First, the committee discussed the progress the district is making in implementing a new type of software for bookkeeping and records called MUNIS. The software was approved earlier this year, and is expected to have its first partial implementation on July 1, 2019, with a total implementation on Jan. 1, 2020.

School Business Official Ann Marie Ellis has been using much of her spare time to head the implementation of the project, according to Superintendent David Thomson, and she said that the software will allow for much greater efficiencies within the

budget process for the schools.

"There will be a lot more efficiencies and a lot more clear reporting," she said. "The end of year report will not take two months to fully vet out... Back in Barnstable it took me two weeks, so it's something to look forward to."

Ellis said the software developer, Tyler Munis, recently gave a demonstration of the software to school and Town officials.

"As in any financial software conversion, there are a lot of objectives to address and Tyler Munis has this down to a science," she said.

Ellis pointed out the first thing they have been doing in the MUNIS committee is to work with trainers from the company coming from Maine, to work out the terminology for the Town so it can be compatible with the

session of in early 2013, when it began ramping up its FBO preparations by constructing a 15,000 square foot hangar and a fuel farm on it, as requested by the NAC.

Since early 2014, however, BEH's relationship with the Commission has steadily soured, with the aspiring FBO taking issue with the NAC's leasing policies regarding availability of Airport apron space, and with what it considered to be excessive and inconsistent financial information requirements, as well as the short lease terms offered.

Additionally, BEH took issue with what it considered to be the Commission's preferential treatment of Flight Level regarding the same matters.

Boston Executive Helicopters' formal FAA complaint (it had filed – and later withdrawn – an informal Part 13 complaint in 2014) concentrated on grant

assurances.

As described in the Director's Determination, the FAA provides funds to local communities for the development of airport facilities; this Airport Improvement Program (AIP) is authorized by the Airport and Airway Improvement Act (AAIA) of 1982.

The Director's Determination states that the AAIA "establishes assurances to which an airport sponsor receiving federal financial assistance must agree as a condition before receiving the assistance. These sponsorship requirements are included in every AIP grant agreement. Upon acceptance of an AIP grant by an airport sponsor, the assurances become a binding obligation between the airport sponsor and the Federal Government."

Since 1982, the Town – which is the owner and sponsor of the Airport – has received 27 grants in federal financial assistance for airfield improvements totaling \$11,577,569.

Boston Executive argued in its 2015 formal complaint that the Airport Commission, and the Town, were in violation of three federal grant assurances – Grant Assurance 22: Economic Nondiscrimination; Grant Assurance 23: Exclusive Rights; and Grant Assurance 5: Rights and Powers, which the FAA – based on the details of that complaint – re-categorized as Grant Assurance 29: Airport Layout Plan.

Grant Assurance 22 protects the reasonable access to federally obligated airports for different types of aeronautical services while Grant Assurance 23 guards against federally obligated airports having only one provider of aeronautical services.

Nearly half of the 36 page Director's Determination addressed Grant Assurance 22, and ultimately concluded in favor of BEH, although it did find the Town not to be in violation with respect to ramp space, requested financial information, and lease term. It did, however, find the Town in violation of it "based upon the combined effect of its delaying tactics, unreasonable and unclear restrictions and requirements, along with the varied and intrusive excessive financial information requests."

(Grant Assurance 22 also marked the major change in the revised determination. The Oct. 30 version – withdrawn by order of the director at the issuance of the Nov. 2 version in order "to correct certain errors" – had the Town and Commission not in violation of Grant Assurance 22.)

The finding for Grant Assurance 23 also favored BEH, referring to the NAC's de facto

restrictions on BEH, but also to its leasing practices, which "have the overall effect of solidifying Flight Level's position at the Airport to the detriment not just for BEH, but any other entity which would be seeking an opportunity to provide FBO services."

The determination regarding Grant Assurance 29 also went against the Town and the Commission. It concerned the Airport leasing a portion of its property – the Verizon lot at the northern end of the airport – for non-aviation use without an FAA release.

Although the Commission sought the FAA's permission to change the designated use for that part of the property, it was never granted, putting the Town and the NAC in violation.

The FAA – at the conclusion of the Director's Determination – ordered the Town and the NAC to provide BEH any remaining requirements for its FBO permit and to complete the process, discontinue any leasing practice providing exclusive rights to a single FBO, and contact the regional FAA office for further guidance regarding the Verizon lot.

The Town and Commission were also directed to submit a corrective action plan to the Director of Airport Compliance within 30 days.

As written in the cover letter, "the Director's Determination does not constitute a Final Agency Decision and order subject to judicial review," and the Town may appeal the determination to the FAA Associate Administrator for Airports within 30 days.

The response to this decision was immediate, with the Airport Commission holding a special meeting on Monday afternoon, Nov. 5, and spending all but a few minutes of it in executive session – which went a little longer than one hour – discussing strategy regarding both the FAA and the federal lawsuit filed against it by BEH, which is scheduled to be heard in U.S. District Court beginning on Dec. 10.

At the conclusion of the session, neither NAC Chair Mark Ryan nor legal counsel Karis North (Murphy, Hesse, Toomey & Lehane, LLC) commented on either matter.

Attorney John Davis (Pierce, Davis, Perritano) – who is representing the Town and the NAC in the federal lawsuit – was also present at the meeting.

On Tuesday night, Nov. 6, the Board of Selectmen also met in an hour long executive session regarding the same business, with Ryan, North, and Davis in attendance.

Afterward, Board of Selectmen Chair Tom Maloney chose not to comment on either matter, citing the fact that the Town is in litigation with BEH.

# Business owner donates \$50,000 to Fire Department

Selectmen learned of an unexpected windfall to the town's budget during Tuesday night's regular Selectmen's meeting — a \$50,000 donation to the Norwood Fire Department (NFD).

NFD Chief George T. Morrice, while giving his regularly scheduled report to the Selectmen, introduced Paul Vallera, owner of Norwood Urgent Care, located on Providence Highway. Explaining that Mr. Vallera felt that the town of Norwood had treated him well when he started his business, Chief Morrice said Vallera wanted to say a few words. "I came to Norwood in 2010, opened an urgent care and was well accepted by the town. I've had interaction with the Fire Department...very polite, respond appropriately...the town's been good to us and I'd like to make a donation to the Fire Department for \$50,000." Vallera then handed a check to Chief Morrice.

Selectmen were surprised and delighted by the news. Recognizing the work of Vallera's Urgent Care business, Selectman Helen Abdallah Donohue said, "We thank you for the great service you're providing to our town." Selectman Allan Howard added, "It is so gra-

cious of you. Thank you very much for that. Every year with our budgets, we've had to tighten them up. This is going to give our chief the money to do some of the things we wouldn't be able to do... it's wonderful."

Vallera said that his interactions with the NFD were always polite and professional which greatly impressed him. "We have other businesses in other locations, but you guys always stand out...I hope it goes to good use." Selectman Paul Bishop made a motion to accept the donation to be expended by Chief Morrice. The motion was unanimously approved.

Morrice also reported on a successful open house that the NFD had hosted, a recently offered EMT refresher course, a new hire starting on Nov. 13 with a possible second hire to follow shortly thereafter. He thanked Julie DiSangro Gross, a local Norwood realtor, for donating a tear-down house to the NFD for training.

Chief William Brooks III, Norwood Police Department (NPD) gave his report noting 111 parking tickets given out in October and in-house training conducted for the NPD in CPR, First Response and Active Shooter. He reiterated that the ban on overnight street parking in Norwood will go into effect starting Nov. 15 – April 1.

Singapore. The two international visitors, who go by the names Bank and Dex, have been in Norwood for the past month exploring environmental sustainability and spending time with various town officials. Remarking on his experience, Dex said, "I learned about the great leadership here. Norwood has great planning...it has overcome a number of challenges over the years. People are able to solve differences for the common good." Bank spoke more personally, saying that he spoke from his heart not his brain and that the visit had surpassed his expectations. "There is no perfect system for sustainability. The most important thing is to understand each other."

When asked what his favorite food was in Norwood, Dex replied, "The Lewis Burger." Chairman Thomas Maloney remarked, "You are always welcome to return. You always have friends here."

Selectman William Plasko raised the issue of a requirement to set a minimum value on the Forbes Hill property that will be offered for sale by the town. After some discussion, it was decided that the recom-

mended minimum price would be \$11 million with the expectation that the bidding process would result in a higher price.

Information regarding Veterans' Day 2018 activities was announced. All activities will take place on Sunday, Nov. 11 with a Veterans' Recognition Mass at 9 a.m. at St. Catherine of Siena Church and another service at St. George's Orthodox Church at 10:00 a.m. All other activities will be in the afternoon with a 1:30 p.m. parade starting from the Balch School that will proceed up Washington Street to the Town Common until 2:15 p.m. Ceremonies at Town Common will take place at 3:00 p.m.

## TOWN SHOULD HOLD ON TO FORBES MANSION

*To the Editor:*

Much attention and focus has been placed on the question of what to do and how to pay for the Forbes Mansion and surrounding open space. Town officials appeared surprised when more than 2/3 of Town Meeting Members approved the purchase of the property for \$13 Million primarily to prevent another 40B from coming to our already housing dense Town of Norwood.

When the nine-member Forbes Hill Task Force was formed, it was disappointing to learn that no one with interests of Conservation, Open Space, Historical Preservation or Recreation was represented, but rather, its composition was chosen from the business community and town officials, who drove the agenda to sell the mansion and property in order to recoup the \$13 Million. It was publicly stated that the property was surplus, so bankers, real estate brokers and developers were immediately brought in. There was no in depth balance of thoughts or ideas or vision to keep or retain this prime piece of property; rather, the option was to sell it

off to the highest bidder with few restrictions. Citizens and taxpayers who might have advocated retaining the property for community use were not represented either. Therefore, many believe not only was the acquisition process flawed, but now, so is the process to sell.

The Survey created by the Task Force resulted in most respondents wanting to keep both the mansion and land. While many believed the Town overpaid for the property, it seems that this great asset has dramatically increased in value, as five developers are vying to buy it for commercial use or to build even more housing, capped at 175 for clustered single, duplex or multi-family homes, condos, or apartments and, as a result, make a tremendous profit for the developer.

Norwood finally owns and controls the Forbes Mansion, its parking lot and a great deal of unspoiled acreage — rare open space that this town desperately needs to retain its character. Joe Sacchi, Registered Land Use Planner for the Massachusetts Area Planning Council (MAPC), publicly stated at the Open Space Forum at the Civic on Tuesday, October 16, 2018, that Norwood has the

least amount of open space than surrounding towns.

What can the property be used for? The entire 27 acres should be for Norwood residents who want Conservation, Open Space, Historic Preservation, and Recreation, to hike, bike, run cross country and walk the trails of this beautiful untapped area of Norwood. The mansion could be for Norwood's best and brightest students and to include a music and fine arts academy for Norwood's impressive music programs. Perhaps even the Gala to celebrate this Town's 150th anniversary in 2022 can be held at the Forbes Mansion.

How to pay for it? A Debt Exclusion for 20 years, similar to the high school, would have an annual cost of less than a dinner for two or a

couple of tanks of gas. We can do this. It will be for Norwood's benefit, not for the benefit of another developer.

Hopefully, Town Meeting Members will reject Article 5 to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell Forbes Mansion and surrounding land and also to reject Article 6 that would create an overlay district that is

# Election a good day for incumbents

This year's midterm election for 2018 saw some of the highest turnout in the country for such an election, with 114 million votes cast as of the date of publication. That's compared to 83 million in 2014.

For Massachusetts, more than 2.4 million people came out to vote and the ballots are still coming in as of publication. For the actual big elections, not much has changed on the political landscape. Elizabeth Warren is more than likely to keep her U.S. Senate Seat against Republican Geoff Diehl with 1.3 million votes against Diehl's 812,052 (60.8 percent to 35.8 percent) with 85 percent of precincts reporting with independent Shiva Ayyadurai coming in at 75,834 votes (3.3 percent).

In a showing of bipartisanship, more than 1.4 million voted (66.5 percent) for Massachusetts Gov. Charlie Baker with 85 percent of precincts reporting against Democratic Challenging Jay Gonzalez, who tallied 749,548 votes (33.5 percent).

Norwood's State Rep. For the 12 Norfolk District John Rogers and Norwood's State Sen. Michael Rush both ran unopposed. For the Massachusetts State Senate, 29 democrats won their elections while Republicans won three, with each currently

leading four other races currently too close to call.

Boston City Councilor Ayanna Pressley will be taking her seat as the first African American woman to represent Massachusetts in the U.S. House of Representatives. The only really close race for House race in Massachusetts was between Bill Keating, currently coming in with 60 percent of the vote and Peter Tedeschi, currently polling with 40.4 percent of the vote, with 86 precincts reporting.

Seth Moulton beat out Republican challenger Joseph Schneider easily with 65.3 percent of the vote versus Schneider's 31.4 percent with 77 percent of precincts reporting. Democrat Katherine Clarke beat out Republican John Hugo with 171,935 votes (75.3 percent) and Hugo's 56,471 votes (24.7 percent).

Democrat Lori Trahan won against both her Republican challenger Rick Green (33.9 percent of the vote) and her inde-

pendent challenger Michael Mullen (4.6 percent of the vote) with 61.6 percent of the vote with 79 percent of precincts reporting. Richard Neal, Joe Kennedy, Ayanna Pressley and Stephen Lynch all ran uncontested.

Attorney General Maura Healey beat out her challenger James McMahon 70.3 percent to 29.7 percent with 86 percent of precincts reporting and 1.6 million votes. The voters also rejected the limit on nurse-to-patient ratios put forth by Ballot Question 1 in a surprising landslide with 1.5 million votes for no and 675,018 for yes. Question 2, the question to create a commission to look over Citizens United passed with 1.59 million votes against 632,996 votes and Question 3 for transgender equality won out in a yes vote with 1.54 million votes to 722,289 votes.

Secretary of State Bill Galvin, State Auditor Suzanne Bump and State Treasurer Deborah Goldberg all kept their seats in the election.






terminology in MUNIS software. She said this can be difficult, as there is a uniform Massachusetts Accounting System they have adhere to as well as a federal code for the Light Department uses and terminology, but she said they're working through it.

"Sometimes as many as three days in a row per week, and that was a schedule to control travel costs," she said.

Thomson added that Ellis has been dedicated on getting the rollout of this software done on time.

"This is an added piece to her day, week or month, and it's a lot of work on her part, but her knowledge of using this system before has been really beneficial to the whole operation," he said.

In other business, Thomson said that recently, the district has been approved for the preliminary round of the STEM High Quality Pathways for Students Grant from the state. While this isn't any actual funding, Thomson said it is a good sign.

It was announced earlier this fall that about \$750,000 would be made available to schools in the Commonwealth in grades K through 12 to focus on applied learning for students in STEM subjects by helping to send them out into the world where these skills are needed. Thomson said they would first look to getting students out to the Norwood Hospital. He said they are looking at a possible \$10,000 to \$15,000 of additional funding.

Assistant Superintendent Alexander Wyeth said the district has also been awarded a \$7,500 grant for Safe and Supportive Schools. He said they applied for \$20,000.

"But the cheapskates only gave us \$7,500," he said with a laugh. "Regardless, we will take that and run with the money and do a lot of good things."

Thomson said they have also been going over the recent safety drills in the district with the Norwood Police Department.

"We are planning the next set of drills, which will be more of the shelter-in-place or hide drills between now and the first of the year," he said.

School Committee Member Michele Eysie Mullen also gave an update on the The Education Cooperative Alternative High School in Walpole. She said there has been an increase in cooperative net income of about 20.6 percent, in that the school took in \$860,000 so far, as opposed to \$713,000 for this same period last year.

"We expect a healthy financial status at year-end," she said, "which is always good news."

She also added that recently technicians came in to test the water fountains and sinks for lead and copper and reported that only one sink, used for hand washing, show elevated levels.

Thomson also said that the Norwood Elks donated dictionaries for all the Grade 3 Students at the Balch Elementary School. He added that the Walpole Walmart also donated school supplies to the same school.

The next School Committee meeting is set for Nov. 28 at 7 p.m.
